Friday, August 29, 2008

## MINUTES

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Chairman Porter called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m. with seven members present and led everyone in the pledge of allegiance. Member Keith held Member Rednour's proxy.

The Chairman announced that the amended agenda calls for the Board to recess and convene as the State Officers Electoral Board. Vice Chairman Schneider so moved to recess to the State Officers Electoral Board at 10:33 a.m. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

The meeting of the State Board of Elections resumed at 10:35 a.m. with a roll call of 7 members present and Member Keith holding Member Rednour's proxy.

Executive Director White presented the minutes with one revision on page 5 which incorporates a list of committees who did not appeal a penalty and final orders were issued. Those committees are Friends of Salas; Voices of Worth; Citizens for Michael Wolczyk; Citizens for Mike Powers; Friends of the Park District; Illinois Business PAC; and Greviskes for Judge. Member McGuffage moved to adopt the minutes be adopted and approved. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

Mr. White indicated that the agenda was amended with a report on the Premier voting system which is under Item A number 4.

The Director said that the Board was meeting on the last business day of August to certify to the election authorities the candidates for the November election ballot, a statewide referendum for a constitutional convention which arises every 20 years, and two retention judges' certifications. Member Keith moved to certify the candidates and the call of the constitutional convention as it appears on the official certification presented to the Board by the staff subject to any subsequent court order affecting the certification of the candidates contained therein and with the exception of Tom Shrier, Democratic candidate for State Representative in the 106<sup>th</sup> District; Rich Garling, Democratic candidate for State Representative in the 52<sup>nd</sup> District; and Miriam Shabo, Republican Candidate for State Representative of the 80<sup>th</sup> District with the consideration of the certification of these three candidates to be the second motion ; and understanding that the Republican candidates for President and Vice President have not been certified to us and that we have a meeting next week to deal with that certification. Member Brady seconded the first motion to certify all the candidates except the three named. The motion passed unanimously by ayes in

unison. Member Keith moved to certify the name of Tom Shrier, Democratic candidate for State Representative of the 106<sup>th</sup> District; Rich Garling, Democratic candidates for State Representative in the 52<sup>nd</sup> District; and Miriam Shabo, Republican candidate for State Representative in the 80<sup>th</sup> District consistent with the order of Judge Kelly even though the objection to the nominating petitions have not been decided by a majority vote of the State Officers Electoral Board. Member Keith explained that the certification would have only their names and party affiliation, and there would not be any indication that an objection was pending. Member Smart seconded the motion. The motion passed by 5-3 with Members Brady, Walters and Vice Chairman Schneider voting no. Member Keith continued with his third motion regarding certification. He indicated that Mr. Allen, an Independent candidate for Senate in the 23<sup>rd</sup> Legislative District has faxed a withdrawal. Member Keith motion was that staff has the authority to accept the original withdrawal and remove him from the certification if received prior to Friday, September 5<sup>th</sup> without the necessity of a Board meeting to ensure that the appropriate election authorities can proceed with setting up their ballot without waiting for the September 5<sup>th</sup> Board meeting. Member McGuffage seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Member Keith confirmed that execution of the certification is recognition of the vote of the Board and not a change of vote from the three members who voted against the motion.

Director White directed the Board to pages 10 and 11 of the packet regarding planning and conducting judges of election schools. This information was submitted for informational purposes.

Mr. White related good news regarding the \$2 million Election Data Collection Grant program. He thanked Member McGuffage for his effort to receive authorization to set up a special non-appropriated fund for spending authority to receive the funds from the federal grant. The treasurer's office has been notified and the trust fund is in Harris Bank in Chicago. The contract with Catalyst Consulting can now be finalized. The application has been prepared and submitted by Chief Fiscal Officer Mike Roate and we anticipate the grant in Illinois shortly. He indicated that a conference call with the sister states who have also received the award will take place shortly to bring us up to date. Mr. White personally thanked the staff for pursuing this, the Board for their support and particularly Member McGuffage for interceding which allowed us to move ahead with the authority from the Comptroller and to receive these funds. Member McGuffage thanked Messrs White and Roate for staying on top of this problem, getting it moving and in place right away. Questions on timing, budget and ownership of any product were discussed. Mr. White asked for a motion to rescind a request for an opinion from the Attorney General regarding the spending authority. Vice Chairman Schneider so moved, Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

The final item regarding preparations for the November General Election was added and is an update to a voting system issue. Premier, formerly Diebold, acknowledged that a programming error occurred in Ohio that may have caused votes to be dropped during electronic transfer of that voting data. Voting Systems Director, Dianne Felts, contacted the 63 jurisdictions that utilize Diebold/Premier and Premier advising them that the Board would be discussing this issue at this meeting. Ms. Felts met with the Premier representation and came up with directives for the election authorities that are the same that the product advisory notice from Premier was to their clients and customers. Ms. Felts assured the board that if the election authorities follow the directives there will be no problem in Illinois. The Board asked Doreen Nelson, Assistant Executive Director of the DuPage Election Board, if she was comfortable using the system in November and she answered affirmatively. Further she said that they had been given excellent support when they took over managing the system themselves. The Board offered their support of Ms. Felts and asked that she create directives for the 63 counties that use the Premier/Diebold system and they would sanction them at the next meeting.

Mr. White directed the Board to page 15 containing a letter from the American Association for People with Disabilities, Common Cause, Demos, and the League of Women Voters nationally and Illinois regarding veterans'

rights to register to vote in November and in future elections. Ms. Sylvia Tillman, Vice President of the League of Women Voters of Illinois and Sergio Estrada, representing the Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs were present in this matter. Ms. Tillman asked that the IDVA agree to be designated as a voter registration agency in the state of Illinois. Mr. Estrada indicated that four nursing homes the control receive federal per diem from the federal VA. The Chairman responded that the SBE is not in a position to order a federal agency to either conduct voter registration or refrain from doing so. Mr. Sandvoss concurred with the Chairman's comment and noted further that he did not believe the Board has the authority to designate federal agencies as voter registration facilities. But they could support a position to encourage voting registration activity.

Mr. White introduced the second voting systems issue. He said that Ms. Felts is asking that certifications in effect for the primary only be extended through the November general election. Mr. Bob Sawicki, Assistant Director of the Chicago Board of Elections was present and available to answer questions. Ms. Felts reported that the modification concerned static electricity which was corrected by changing to noncoded screws. She stated that getting the modification through the EAC was moving very slowly and certification would not be ready by the general election. Mr. Sawicki indicated that modifications made worked well. Member Keith moved to continue modification certification through the general election scheduled for November, 2008. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously by roll call vote.

The legislative update was briefed by Cris Cray, legislative liaison, who was present in the Springfield office via telephonic call. Ms. Cray indicated that all elections bills, except for three, have been signed. Senate Bills 2190 and 2191, both campaign disclosure related were expected to be signed shortly. She said that the election bill that was not signed that was amendatorily vetoed was the ethics act and the Executive Order has not yet been posted. Rupert Borgsmiller, Steve Sandvoss and she met with legislative caucuses to discuss Act Blue legislation and will meet again in September. Ms. Cray indicated that Mike Roate was working on a supplemental appropriation bill which would include the money that was vetoed out and additional money to implement ethics.

Mr. White concluded his report with an update of the fiscal status of the Board. He will have an update at the next meeting and close out the books for FY08 and a beginning status report for FY09. Member Walters asked for clarification of collections. Mr. White answered that funding is returned to the general revenue fund and collections from campaign disclosure fines is directly deposited in the general revenue fund also. In response to a question from Member Smart, Mr. White said that a budget report will be submitted at the September meeting.

Steve Sandvoss, General Counsel began his report with appeals of campaign disclosure fines and asked to combine items 3A1,2, and 4; an appeal that was included as part of a complaint following closed preliminary hearing; and 08MA007. Ms. Mariyana Spyropoulos said that the filing was timely due to a holiday, but didn't have documentation to prove her case. Mr. Borgsmiller called for copies of the reports and this matter was continued to later in the meeting.

Mr. Sandvoss noted that Mr. Rex Bradfield was present in 08MA007 and 08CD26. Mr. Bradfield agreed to hearing the complaint in open session and offered to make a settlement in both cases. Member McGuffage moved to accept the respondent's offer to settle complaint 08MA007 and 08CD26 in the amount of \$3,000 in disposition of the fine to be paid within 30 days. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed 6-2 with Members Brady and Keith voting against the motion.

The Board returned to *SBE v. Citizens for Mariyana Spyropoulos*, L14382, 08AG003. Retrieved documents showed that the A-1 was due on Friday, January 17; January 21 was a holiday; and the report was received on January 22<sup>nd</sup>,

one day late. Member Keith moved to approve the recommendation of the hearing officer and the general counsel and deny the appeal. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously by roll call vote.

The General Counsel continued with *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Brenda L. Thompson*, L13794, 07AE050, an appeal carried over from June; *SBE v. Citizens for Donald India*, L14105, 08DS270; and *SBE v. Committee to Elect LaVetta Williams Judge*, S9437, 08DS273. Member Keith moved to adopt the recommendations of the hearing officer and general counsel and to deny the appeals in all three cases. Member Smart seconded the motion. Vice Chairman Schneider presided in the Chairman's absence and asked if there was any discussion on the motion. Hearing none, he asked for roll call. The motion was adopted by 8-0.

For informational purpose, the following campaign disclosure items were submitted: potential ballot forfeiture for 2008 of which there were none; and payment of civil penalties which shows committees have made payments up through and including July 11 of this year.

Mr. Sandvoss presented the Voting System Approval Application Fee Structure proposed rule for the Board's consideration. After discussing changes to a few words and specifying that the fee has to be paid before testing begins were complete, Member Keith moved to send the rule on with the changes that Ms. Felts would be helpful in clarification. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed 8-0 by roll call vote.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved that the Board recess and convene in Executive Session for purposes of considering cases filed and heard following a closed preliminary hearing, for pending litigation and personnel matters. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by 8 ayes in unison. The Board recessed at 12:34 p.m.

The Board returned to open session at 1:42 p.m.

Member Keith stated that since they were back in open session and having voted on the prevailing side, he moved to reconsider the action taken on 08AG003, Citizens for Mariyana Spyropoulos. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed 8-0 by roll call vote. Member Keith explained that he understood that Ms. Spyropoulos wanted to make additional presentation which is why he asked for its reconsideration. Ms. Spyropoulos made a settlement offer of 5% of the fine, but did not realize that the fine was reduced as low as statutorily possible. Mr. Sandvoss stated that the original motion would stand; that the motion to reconsider was granted, but the Board decided not to change the terms of the original motion which was to deny the appeal and reduce it to 10%.

Member Keith moved to continue 08CD036 as was done in Executive Session to the meeting in Chicago on October 20<sup>th</sup>.

As to *SBE v. Citizens for David Webb*, 08CD007; and *SBE v. Friends for David Webb Jr.*, 08CD010, Vice Chairman Schneider moved to find that the complaints were filed on justifiable grounds, that the committee has until September 30<sup>th</sup> to file all the necessary reports. If they do so by September 30<sup>th</sup>, the matter will be concluded other than the ordinary review by staff of the adequacy of those filings; and that if such reports are not on file by September 30<sup>th</sup>, the matter will be placed on our agenda for our October meeting. These matters were ratified by the second of Member Keith and passed unanimously by 8 yeas in unison.

A short discussion was had by the board regarding the special video conference meeting on September 5<sup>th</sup>.

The Board recognized Ms. Jean Kazmarek, co-chair of Illinois Ballot Integrity Project, DuPage Chapter. She read a statement and asked the Board to recommend that the Attorney General move forward on her complaint. Several


Board Members advised Ms. Kazmarek that the Board of Elections is not the proper place for her complaint and made suggestions for her to consider.



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The special meeting of the State Board of Elections was called to order via videoconference means at 10:00 a.m. with seven Members present. Chairman Porter, Vice Chairman Schneider and Members Brady and McGuffage were present in the Chicago office, Members Keith and Smart were present in the Springfield office and Member Rednour was connected via teleconference. Member Walters was absent and Member Smart held his proxy.

The first item on the agenda was certification of Republican Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates for the November General Election ballot. The Executive Director explained this was an amendment to the original certification and the names of John McCain for President and Sarah Palin for Vice-President were to be included in the certification. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the amended certification. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Next on the agenda was consideration of an amendment to the Proclamation of Results from the Primary Election. The General Counsel explained this was a result of an Order of the Circuit Court of Cook County in the election contest of *Stern v. Ross* and the State Board of Elections is required to amend the Proclamation based on the court's decision. The new canvass totals indicate the margin of victory for Dominique Ross was 157.83 votes but it did not change the outcome of the election as the original proclamation resulted in Ms. Ross being nominated. Fifty votes were added to Ms. Ross's margin of victory according to the new canvass totals. Member Smart moved to amend the

Proclamation of Results from the Primary Election as directed by the Order. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director presented pending candidate withdrawals following certification. Withdrawals have been received from Daniel P. Darcy, Cook County Judicial Circuit and Mary S. Schostok, 19<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit. SBE staff contacted those election jurisdictions affected by the withdrawals and none of them objected. However, Chicago Board of Elections indicated if any withdrawals are received after this date, they would not be able to amend their ballots. Member Keith moved to accept the candidate withdrawals. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director presented a status update on Premier Customer Directives for election night. He asked this matter be carried over to the September 15<sup>th</sup> Board meeting because of the short timeframe from the last Board meeting. It was agreed to place the matter on the September 15<sup>th</sup> agenda.

The next item on the agenda was executive session. The General Counsel informed the Board that unless there was any further discussion regarding the statement of findings, an executive session would not be necessary. He further noted that it would be acceptable if the Board wanted to make a motion in open session to enter the statements into record and cause the record to be filed in the Appellate Court pursuant to the court's directive. The General Counsel informed the Board that the Assistant Attorney General assigned to the case requested the Board enter the statement into the record and issue an order to that effect. Member Keith offered his concerns and suggested adopting a standing rule at a future meeting that a Member can explain their vote at any time and submit it into the record. Member Smart moved to enter this matter into the record. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director thanked the Board for assembling for today's meeting and reminded everyone the next meeting is scheduled for September 15<sup>th</sup> in Springfield and Chicago via videoconference.

With there being no further business before the Board Member McGuffage moved to adjourn until September 15, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 10:15 a.m.

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The regular monthly meeting of the State Board of Elections was called to order at 10:45 a.m. with eight members present. Chairman Porter, Vice Chairman Schneider and Member Brady were present in the Chicago office and connected via videoconference. Member Smart was connected via telephone.

The Executive Director welcomed Member Smart to the meeting wishing him a speedy recovery from his recent surgery.

The Executive Director reported on the Advisory Committee meeting held this morning. Discussions took place on the November 2008 general election, including the issue of the canvassing, and legislation. Staff also updated the committee on the progress of the statewide voter registration database and the EAC data collection grant. The next meeting of the Advisory Committee will be January 20, 2009.

Director White discussed the preparations for the November 4, 2008 General Election and indicated that Premier (Diebold) voting equipment encountered problems in Ohio. Dianne Felts presented proposed directives for Premier clients to follow on election night so none of the problems encountered in Ohio happen in Illinois. Ms. Felts indicated that there was a sharing violation with the voting equipment and if multiple memory cards are uploaded simultaneously the vote totals would not be correct. Nothing has been changed with the software or hardware and staff will be testing two

jurisdictions who use this equipment. The Board agreed that staff should proceed with the directives and distribute to the election authorities.

Director White commented on the public information program and the recent press release distributed on voter registration figures. A public service announcement has been filmed and will be distributed.

Over 120 judges of election training schools have been scheduled for the upcoming weeks. An update will be provided at the next meeting.

The Executive Director presented for Board consideration a withdrawal from Susan Radzinowicz, a Republican candidate for State Representative in the 11<sup>th</sup> district. Discussion ensued on accepting or not accepting the withdrawal and the consequences for each. The Chicago Board has indicated that after September 5 they would not be willing to change the ballot. The General Counsel discussed the court case in DuPage County where the county was sued for not removing a name from the ballot. The State Board of Elections amended the certification but DuPage was not going to follow suit and remove the candidate from the ballot. The lawsuit ordered DuPage to comply with our amended certification but included a statement saying that if it was a practical impossibility to comply with it that the election authority not be compelled to file that certification or the amended certification. Following further discussion Member Keith moved to accept the withdrawal of candidacy, amend the certification and request the election authority to remove the name from the ballot if it is a practicality that they can do so and cite the DuPage County case including the "practical impossibility" language. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director presented for Board consideration another amendment to the 2008 General Election ballot certification. A candidate was on the primary ballot as A. Ghani (formerly known as Abdul Ghani) but on the general ballot certified just as A. Ghani due to a glitch. The Election Code requires any candidate whose name has changed during the three year period preceding the filing of his nominating papers to have included on the ballot his former name and date of the name change, along with his current name. Member Brady moved to amend the certification

consistent with the name change as indicated in the memorandum from the General Counsel. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The Executive Director discussed legislative activity indicating the House met last week to discuss ethics legislation, sweeps of agency funds and restoration of funds for some state agencies. Several e-mails were exchanged between SBE staff and legislative staff explaining that our federal funding is dedicated to fulfilling HAVA requirements and we were able to convince them these could not be used in the sweep. The House restored some of the funds cut from agencies budgets and allotted the SBE \$425,000 for the purpose of preventing layoffs and maintaining basic operations. Director White noted that the Senate is not likely to return before November. He thanked Cris Cray and Mike Roate for their efforts on behalf of the SBE. In response to a request from Member Keith, Director White indicated information would be prepared on what exactly what was requested in our original budget and what we received (which was reduced from our request) for our FY 10 budget and how to prioritize these additional funds if we do in fact receive them. Discussion ensued on the requested testing center which would require approximately \$1 million to get started. This included leasing a location as well as ten staff positions. Cris Cray indicated she currently has a chart with the requested information and she would include a new column for the additional funds.

Ms. Cray reviewed her legislative wrap up memo of last week's House actions. House Bill 824 contains the exact language that was in the ethics bill as now shown in the lottery lease bill which takes effect January 1. She suggested asking for a supplemental to cover costs incurred from the Ethics bill. Mike Hoffman was at the session last week and filed support for our budget supplemental. Discussion ensued on next year's legislative proposals and Member McGuffage suggested including a proposal regarding campaign disclosure fines and the ability to assess on a percentage basis, and a proposal to have an outcome of a 4-4 tie vote of the Board.

The Executive Director presented a review of the legislative program and the procedures from start to finish. The past two years have been difficult but on the whole the SBE has had considerable success. Director White discussed some points where we could do better including making more frequent contact with legislative staff, individual legislators, contact with the Governor's office,

seeking support from election authorities for our budget, and Board member participation. Member Keith thanked Dan White, Cris Cray, Steve Sandvoss and Mike Roate for preparing this information and indicated there are some good ideas. He also suggested that staff meet personally with the committee chairs as well as everyone on the committee and the Governor's office and inviting committee staff to visit the SBE during a testing season or campaign filing period.

Director White indicated the Veteran's Administration has reversed their position on the issue of voter registration activities at their facilities. This was on last month's agenda and representatives from the Veteran's Administration as well as League of Women Voters appeared and discussed the issue. The Veteran's Administration will now allow non-partisan voter registration drives at the VA facilities.

The Executive Director presented the final FY 08 fiscal status report for the period ending August 31 and the FY 08 and FY 09 fiscal reports for the Help Illinois Vote Fund. All 2008 obligations have been met and approximately \$494,000 will be returned to the State Treasury. Also presented for informational purposes was the two year plan of activity for the months of September and October.

The General Counsel presented *SBE v. Annual Roosevelt Cocktail Party*, 07CD069. Mr. Sandvoss reviewed the background of the complaint indicating the committee has been given ample opportunity to resolve the issues. Staff has not received satisfactory resolution of the issues at hand. Mr. Sandvoss noted that this matter has been carried over for many months and it seems there is a pattern that they do just enough to avoid getting a penalty assessed but do not fully resolve the issues. He recommended that the Board issue an order commanding them to file amendments to the reports at issue to the satisfaction of the campaign disclosure staff within 30 days of the issuance of the order or they will be assessed a penalty of \$5,000 for failure to comply with such an order. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to file the order as recommended by the General Counsel. Member Keith seconded the motion but also asked for an amendment that after the 30<sup>th</sup> day it be a penalty of \$100 a day up to \$5,000 rather than the \$5,000 penalty immediately. Vice Chairman Schneider accepted the amendment. The motion passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented for Board consideration a request for a payment plan from the 34<sup>th</sup> Ward Democratic Organization. The organization has submitted \$500 with a request to follow up with \$1,000 to be paid in December 2008, \$1,000 to be paid in March of 2009 and the remaining \$1,000 to be paid in June of 2009. Member Keith moved to accept the payment plan as presented with each payment to be due by the end of each month as outlined in the letter. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented for informational purposes a listing of committees who have paid civil penalties.

The General Counsel presented complaints following public hearings. No one was present in any of these matters. Mr. Sandvoss concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officers that in all these cases the board issue an order compelling the respondents to file the reports within 30 days of the Board order with two exceptions: *SBE v. Committee to Election Joseph McAfee for the 8<sup>th</sup> Ward*, that there be no further action as they filed the report other than referral to staff for appropriate assessment of civil penalties and *SBE v. Citizens to Election Alvin Parks, Jr.*, that no further action is necessary as they amended the report to the satisfaction of the staff. In response to a question, the General Counsel noted that in *SBE v. Citizens for Catherine Zaryczny*, the language will be changed to "may" result in a fine. Member Keith moved with that change to adopt the recommendations of the hearing officer and General Counsel in the matters of *SBE v. 16<sup>th</sup> Ward Democratic Organization*, 08CD006; *SBE v. New Lenox Democrats*, 08CD009; *SBE v. Bellwood Pride Party*, 08CD014; *SBE v. 25<sup>th</sup> Ward Democratic Political Alliance*, 08CD023; *SBE v. Committee to Elect Joseph McAfee for the 8<sup>th</sup> Ward*, 08CD024; *SBE v. Friends of Don Patterson*, 08CD027; *SBE v. Citizens for Catherine Zaryczny*, 08CD028 and *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Alvin Parks, Jr.*, 08CD035. Member Rednour seconded the motion. Mr. Borgsmiller asked that in the *Parks* case that it be required all subsequent reports should be filed in substantial compliance for one year because of the filing irregularities the committee has had. Member Keith and Member Rednour accepted the amendment and the motion passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

Member Keith moved to recess to executive session for the purpose of discussing a campaign disclosure matter and pending litigation. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Meeting recessed at 12 noon and reconvened at 12:15 p.m.


Member Keith moved in the matter of *David Reece v. Citizens for Judge Golden*, 08CD37 it be found filed on justifiable grounds and no further action is necessary and an order be placed upon the respondent committee to timely and completely comply with all requirements for the next 12 months or stand subject to being fined in violation of a Board order. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The General Counsel noted that there has been communication between himself, Member Brady and Member Keith regarding the issuance of a standing order by the State Board of Elections which was tied into discussion on September 5 regarding the authority given by the Board to any member to enter into the official record a statement of explanation of a vote, whether it is pursuant to a court order or otherwise. He submitted proposed language to both members. He will present a final draft to the Board for consideration at the October meeting. In response to a request from Member Brady, Mr. Sandvoss noted he would draft a Board procedure so that this scenario could be avoided in the future.

The next regular meeting of the State Board of Elections will be held on Monday, October 20, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. in Chicago.

With there being no further discussion, Member Schneider moved to adjourn until October 20 or the call of the chair. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 12:20 p.m.

This election our statewide voter public awareness program focused on voter registration requirements, early voting and grace period registration.

A series of press releases began in early September announcing voter registration information, that early voting is available for the first time for a Presidential Election in Illinois and that grace period registration also allows a second opportunity to register to vote after the October 7 deadline (see attached Press Releases). The releases were e-mailed statewide to our media listing of forty journalists, faxed to a dozen more and hand delivered to the Statehouse Press Room at the Capitol

We also provided news release templates to election authorities so they could publicize early voting in their local jurisdictions.

In cooperation with Illinois Information Services we produced radio and television Public Service Announcements in both English and Spanish about voter registration and early voting. They were distributed to 125 outlets across the state.

### **Voter Registration Deadline is Oct. 7**

SPRINGFIELD, IL, Sept. 7, 2008 – Illinois had 7.3 million registered voters as of Labor Day, according to a statewide, centralized voter registration database at the State Board of Elections.

For the Nov. 4 general election, the traditional registration deadline is Oct. 7.

“History tells us there will be a surge in voter registrations as the traditional registration deadline approaches,” said Daniel W. White, executive director of the State Board of Elections. “The official total of 7,304,563 registered for the Feb. 5 Illinois primary election established a new record high of registrations for a primary.”

White also noted the turnout for the Feb. 5 Illinois primary shattered the previous record for a primary turnout by 17 percent.

The requirements for a person to register are: be a citizen of the United States; be at least 18 years of age by Election Day; and have been a resident of the precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day.

Although Oct. 7 is the traditional last day to register, Grace Period Registration is an extension of the traditional deadline. It allows for the registration of voters and for a change of address at the office of the election authority. However, it also places limitations on how these registrants can vote.

### FIRST PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION WITH EARLY VOTING

**SPRINGFIELD, IL, Sept. 16, 2008** – Eligible voters in Illinois may cast a ballot as early as Oct. 13 or 14 without having to provide a reason or an excuse for wanting to vote early.

Because Oct. 13 is a state holiday – Columbus Day – most early voting centers will not open until Oct. 14. Election authorities across the state will announce the locations of early voting centers and their hours of operation. The last day to vote at an early voting center is Thursday, Oct. 30.

“Since Presidential elections in November traditionally produce the largest turnout of voters, we expect an increase in the number of people taking advantage of the early voting option,” said Daniel W. White, executive director of the State Board of Elections. “Approximately 220,000 people cast ballots at early voting centers in the Illinois primary, and, counting absentee ballots, nearly 11 percent of the primary vote was cast prior to Election Day.”

“Based on early voting histories in other states, early voting becomes more popular with every election, especially when it is first introduced,” White said.

Approximately 20 percent of the national vote was cast early in the 2004 general election, according to the Early Voting Information Center at Reed College in Oregon.

The early voting law in Illinois, which was approved in 2005, requires voters casting a ballot at an early voting center to display valid identification such as a current driver's license, a state-issued ID card or another government issued-ID with a photograph. The requirement of photo identification for an early voter is stricter than other identification requirements for people casting a ballot at their polling place on Election Day.

State law prohibits a person who voted at an early voting center from voting again on Election Day. The votes cast at early voting centers are not counted until Election Day.

Also, absentee voting laws remain in place. Persons who desire an absentee ballot should contact their local election authority for an application or for more information.

Draft News Release GRACE PERIOD for Oct. 8

#### DEADLINE EXTENDED FOR VOTER REGISTRATION

SPRINGFIELD, IL, Oct. 8, 2008 – The deadline to register to vote in the Nov. 4 Presidential election has been extended to Oct. 21.

Under the terms of a state law effective for the first time in a November Presidential election, eligible voters are granted a “grace period” for registering to vote. However, the law restricts where people may register during the grace period and how they cast a ballot.

Eligible voters may register during the grace period only at the office of their election authority. Elections are administered locally by the State’s 110 election authorities – 101 county clerks, one county election commission and eight municipal election commissions.

To be eligible to register to vote, a person must:

- Be a citizen of the United States;
- Be at least 18 years of age by Election Day;
- Have been a resident of the precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day.

During the 2008 primary election, 7,803 people registered to vote in Illinois during the grace period.

People who register during the grace period must vote in the office of the election authority or vote absentee by mail. People who register during the grace period do not go to their polling place on Election Day, nor are they allowed to vote at early voting centers.

Early voting, first used in Illinois in the 2006 elections, allows registered voters to cast a ballot at early voting centers between Oct. 13 or 14 (depending on your location) and Oct. 30 without having to provide a reason or an excuse.

The law requires voters casting a ballot at an early voting center to display valid identification such as a current driver’s license, a state-issued ID card or another government issued-ID with a photograph. The requirement of photo identification for an early voter is stricter than other identification requirements for people casting a ballot at their polling place on Election Day.

State law prohibits a person who voted at an early voting center from voting again on Election Day. The votes cast at early voting centers are not counted until Election Day.

Also, absentee voting laws remain in place. Persons who desire an absentee ballot should contact their local election authority for an application or for more information.

The State Board of Elections is an independent constitutional agency charged with the responsibility of having general supervision over the administration of election laws of the State.

As you know, the SBE submitted a grant application to the EAC in April for funding to develop administrative and procedural "best practices" for the collection of data at the precinct level for the November 4, 2008 General Election that can be used as a model for and replicated by other states. The Agency received notification from the EAC on May 28 that Illinois was chosen as one of five states (Minnesota, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin) awarded a \$2 million grant for the collection of this data.

The EAC Data Collection Grant is only for the collection of data for the November 4<sup>th</sup> General Election. This should not be confused with the requirements of P.A. 95-699 (effective November 9, 2007) mandating Election Authorities transmit vote totals electronically. The funds requested in the FY09 budget (and requiring subsequent annual appropriations) for the electronic canvass project did not receive legislative approval.

The SBE had originally requested spending authority for the Data Collection Grant as a subsequent addition to the original FY09 budget request submission (added before the Legislative session began). This line item was reviewed and passed in the Agency's House/Senate budget bill but was amendatory vetoed by the Governor.

As a result, a dedicated Data Collection Grant special fund (created with unique non-appropriated spending authority necessary to disburse grant monies received from the EAC) was completed by the Comptroller and Treasurer with confirmation documents received in late August. Once confirmation was received, a contract was finalized with Catalyst Consulting Group, Inc. and signed on August 29, with the initial request for quarterly funding (approximately \$250,000) also submitted to the EAC on that date.

The Data Collection Grant application included a proposal to increase staffing, but no such new staff has been added as outlined in the grant proposal. Pat Freeman withdrew as Project Director, and we have not hired the two permanent employees (one position in the Division of Election Information and one position in the Information Technology Division). I have assumed the role of Project Director but cannot commit "full-time" to the project due to the demands placed on my time as Director of Election Information. As outlined in the grant proposal, the experience and expertise of Steve Flowers, Director of Information Technology, is essential for the success of this project as is the participation of Kyle Thomas as Director of Voter Registration Services responsible for the Illinois Voter Registration System (IVRS).

An initial meeting with Catalyst Consulting was conducted on September 3 to address numerous issues associated with the Data Collection Grant and the “deliverables” of the contract. Election Authorities from the following jurisdictions have been asked to participate as pilot sites for this project (based upon several factors):

The Illinois Voter Registration System (IVRS) has made great progress in these weeks leading up to the election. We currently have 108 election jurisdictions connected to IVRS and using it daily to receive State Unique Identifiers (SUID) for all of their registered voters. Cook and McHenry counties are receiving programming which should bring them online in the very near future.

Duplicate checks are being performed for every registration that is entering the database as well as duplicate checks on those records already contained in the database. We are also providing the jurisdictions notifications for matches against death certificates received from the Department of Public Health.

All signatures that were contained in the legacy VISTA system have been copied over to IVRS in an effort to save transmission times from the jurisdictions and the newly added signatures will be enabled for transmission into IVRS in the near future.

Programming is nearly complete to allow for batch matching of all records containing a driver's license number against the Secretary of State's database to identify errors/fraudulent records. As soon as this feature is enabled, we will also be enabling the batch matching of records containing Social Security Numbers (SSN) against the Social Security Administration's (SSA) database to identify potential errors/fraudulent records. We currently have interactive verification of SSN's with the SSA for individual records.

We are still waiting for the Department of Corrections to send us the user agreement in order for us to receive data from them to compare to the database. This agreement is still under review by their legal department. They have been contacted numerous times about this issue. In the meantime, we are using the sample file they provided to make as much progress as possible on the programming end. Once the legal paperwork is signed, this piece of the project will move quickly.

Many jurisdictions have taken advantage of our offer for one-on-one training of the IVRS system. In September alone, we trained 34 separate jurisdictions on the new system and its functionality. This effort has continued into October as well and we expect to surpass 40 jurisdictions having received training. This one-on-one training is in addition to the 15 Regional Training Workshops we provided in June and July.

All of the vendors except VOTEC have completed the work as required by their contract with us. VOTEC has not yet completed the live interaction portion, though they do have the programming complete to allow their customers to connect to us in a batch form. They have assured us that they will complete their modifications following this election.

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You recall that at the September Board meeting I reported the Illinois House had restored \$425,780 to our FY09 budget appropriation and that we were awaiting action of the Senate. On Tuesday, September 23, the Senate passed the exact same restoration appropriation bill and funding for the bill.

On Monday, October 6, the Senate forwarded the restoration appropriation bill and funding bill to the Governor's office. The Governor has sixty days to act on the legislation.

I have contacted the Governor's office on several occasions to express our need for approval of this budget funding. They have indicated that the Governor's budget office has some issues with the funding aspects of the legislation. We will continue to monitor this legislation and urge its approval.

We have just been notified that the Governor has signed the funding bill (SB 790), but has not yet taken action on the appropriation restoration bill.

Also as requested, I have attached a chart that specifically identifies line items of the \$425,780 the legislature has thus far restored. The \$425,780 is designated for the sole purpose of maintaining basic operations and preventing layoffs. The amount was determined pursuant to discussions with House majority staff. The chart also tracks status of our FY09 budget appropriation in six columns – from submission of our original FY09 request, to passage by the legislature, to gubernatorial cuts, to its current status after legislative restorations.

We also have drafted a supplemental appropriation bill that will be submitted to the General Assembly in the veto session, which is scheduled to begin Wednesday, November 12. The supplemental will seek to restore funding levels to that of our initial FY09 appropriation request.

Sacramento, CA – Access to state-level campaign finance information has improved dramatically since 2003 due to the increase in electronic filing of campaign disclosure reports, according to *Grading State Disclosure 2008*. The report, released today, represents the fifth nationwide assessment of state campaign disclosure laws and practices conducted by the Campaign Disclosure Project and can be found online at: [www.campaigndisclosure.org](http://www.campaigndisclosure.org).

Washington State earned an A in 2008 and has ranked first in each of the five Grading State Disclosure studies. California and Michigan also earned As in 2008. Tennessee earned the distinction of being the most improved state since 2003 and Montana improved the most in the last year. Listings of states' 2008 grades and ranks are attached.

The Campaign Disclosure Project seeks to bring greater transparency and accountability to money in state politics. The project is a collaboration of the California Voter Foundation, the Center for Governmental Studies, and the UCLA School of Law and is supported by The Pew Charitable Trusts.

"Electronic filing has a direct impact on access to campaign data and how useful that data is online. State disclosure agencies are far more likely to present campaign finance data in ways that allow the public to search, sort, and download the information when disclosure reports are initially filed electronically in a digital format," said Kim Alexander, president of the California Voter Foundation.

In the 2008 assessment, 40 states earned a passing grade and ten failed. Twenty-four states earned grades in the A or B range, up from just two awarded five years ago. Thirty-six states have improved their grades since 2003 and 26 improved over last year's assessment. The driving force behind the improvements has been the increase in the number of states requiring that candidates file disclosure reports electronically. Twenty-four states now require both statewide and legislative candidates to file electronically, up from twelve in 2003. In all, 42 states permit candidates to file electronically, 30 of which require electronic filing by some candidates.

"It is very encouraging that so many states have improved, both in the last year and since the first assessment in 2003," said Bob Stern, president of the Center for Governmental Studies. "Obviously, the fact that ten states failed is disappointing, but voters in most states have far better access to disclosure

records than when this project started, even in some failing states."

The Campaign Disclosure Project evaluates, grades, and ranks each state in four categories: campaign disclosure laws; electronic filing programs; public access to campaign finance data; and disclosure web site usability. The Grading State Disclosure study shows which states provide the best access to disclosure data, areas where states could better serve voters, and suggestions for improvement.

Among the study's significant findings:

- States with the strongest campaign disclosure programs, by rank, are: Washington (1st); California (2nd); Michigan (3rd); Oregon (4th); Florida and Virginia (tied for 5th); Hawaii and Missouri (tied for 7th); Colorado (9th); and New Jersey (10th).
- States with the weakest campaign disclosure programs, by rank, are: New Mexico (41st); Nebraska (42nd); Vermont (43rd); Mississippi (44th); Nevada (45th); Delaware (46th); North Dakota (47th); South Dakota (48th); Alabama (49th); and Wyoming (50th).
- Tennessee earned a B and ranked 13th in 2008, and was the most improved state since 2003, when the state earned an F and ranked 46th. Montana improved the most since 2007, earning its first passing grade and posting campaign finance data online for the first time in 2008.
- Thirty-nine states offer the public searchable, online databases of campaign contributions; 93 percent of the states that require electronic filing provide such databases, while just 38 percent of the states with no electronic filing program do so.

"Our web site usability tests found that two-thirds of the state web sites improved compared to 2007," said Joe Doherty, Director of the Empirical Research Group at UCLA School of Law. "The states made it easier to find their disclosure pages, but there is still a lot of room for improvement. Forty-percent of the state web sites were rated poorly."

Each state was assessed, graded, and ranked for its overall performance as well as its performance in each of the four grading categories. States performed best in the disclosure law and web site usability categories, with 45 states passing and five failing in each. Thirty states passed in the electronic filing category and 20 failed. Thirty-six states passed in the data accessibility category, while 14 failed.

The Campaign Disclosure Project sets a high, but not impossible, standard for state campaign finance disclosure. Grading criteria were developed by the Campaign Disclosure Project partners, the project's advisory board and a panel of expert judges, who also assisted with the grading process. In developing the criteria, efforts were made to balance the concerns of practitioners and government officials with the public's need for timely, complete, and effective disclosure.

State assessments are based on research of state laws as of December 31, 2007, survey results from state disclosure agency staff, web site visits and online research, and web site testing by outside evaluators. *Grading State Disclosure 2008* is available in print and online, and features a nationwide overview of state disclosure laws and practices, an assessment of each state, and charts, graphs, and maps illustrating state disclosure performance. The Project's web site,



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### The State of Disclosure in Illinois

Illinois has earned a B in all five of the Grading State Disclosure assessments conducted since 2003. Gains made in the accessibility category were offset by a lower grade in the usability category, and Illinois slipped from 9th in 2007 to 14th in the overall rankings this year.

Illinois's disclosure law earned a C and the 30th ranking in this area in 2008. Candidates are required to itemize contributions of \$150 or more, with occupation and employer data disclosed for those giving more than \$500. Expenditures of more than \$150 are also reported, but subvendor information is not. Independent expenditures made in the two months prior to an election must be disclosed, but independent expenditures made outside of that timeframe are not reported. Illinois earned an A+ and a number one ranking in the electronic filing category again in 2008, as both statewide and legislative candidates who raise or spend \$10,000 must file electronically. To assist filers, the State Board of Elections archives videos of informative campaign disclosure seminars online.

Illinois's Disclosure Content Accessibility grade improved to an A and a top ten ranking in 2008, up from a B+ and 14th in 2007. The State Board of Elections debuted a new web site that has preserved the strengths of the previous site

while introducing new tools for accessing disclosure data. Site visitors can browse electronically-filed reports, or take advantage of searchable databases of contributions and expenditures that are among the best in the nation. The new site retains the previous site's excellent database searching and sorting options, and users can now also download search results for offline analysis. Another nice feature found within the databases is that search results are preceded by summary information that includes the total number of transactions returned, as well as the cumulative total of the results. The public can also review summary data from paper-filed reports that has been data-entered by agency staff.

While the new State Board of Elections site is clean and easy to navigate, the state dropped from a B+ to a B- since its debut primarily due to the 2008 usability test. Usability testers had a more difficult time navigating to the disclosure site from the state of Illinois's homepage than testers did in 2007, which speaks more to issues with the state's web site than the disclosure agency's site. The disclosure site itself has been made easier to navigate through the use of tabs, graphics and lists of the "Most Popular" features on the site. The site features excellent contextual information, such as its annual "Money and Elections in Illinois" reports that summarize state-level candidate campaign financing, a glossary of common campaign disclosure terms, and a clear description of the data available online. Providing basic instructions for using the database search features would further add to the usability of the disclosure site.

**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing the  
2008 June Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received July 23, 2008, 2 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$200. In addition, this Committee had previously been assessed a \$25 civil penalty (not appealed, stayed) for delinquently filing the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$225.

Maritia M. Griffith, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Griffith stated that the Club had every intention of filing the report in a timely fashion. She spent several hours on Monday 7/21/08 trying to file the report on-line. She set up an account and received a password. This was the day of the massive wind storms in the Quad Cities and she was limited in access to computers that had power. (Tens of thousands of people had no power at all). She was unsuccessful in being able to file on-line. She was told by someone at the Board that the fine was \$25 for late filing so she took the report to the Rock Island Post Office around 2:00 pm and sent it overnight, but apparently it took 2 days to arrive. They are a very small club that is struggling to rebuild its membership and they ask the Board's consideration in reducing the fine or waiving it.

In order to be consistent with previous Board decisions when an electronic filing issue is presented as a defense, I recommend that the appeal be granted. Records show that she did obtain a Filer Identification Number and therefore, did plan to file the report electronically, as her contacts with Board staffs indicate. In addition, there were violent thunderstorms in that area at that time, resulting in major power outages. Ultimately the report was filed on paper, and not electronically, but she did attempt to file electronically during what was, by all indications, a difficult time to attempt to conduct any kind of business in the Quad Cities. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the stay will remain on the original \$25 civil penalty.



**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Delinquently Filing the  
2008 June Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received on July 22, 2008, 1 day late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$25.

Joyce Anderson, the Secretary of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance, and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Anderson stated that the Committee's defense was the length of time required for a first class piece of mail containing the report to reach Springfield. All state and county reports were signed and mailed on Wednesday, July 16, 2008. The Lee County Clerk recorded their document on July 17<sup>th</sup>. Six days for first class mail to travel 200 miles to the state capitol is unreasonable and should not result in a fine for a PAC for noncompliant filing.

Section 100.125 (a) of Board Rules and Regulations states that a report, either a pre-election report or a semi-annual report, mailed more than 72 hours prior to the due date, shall be considered timely filed, regardless of when received by the Board. Unfortunately, the timestamp is illegible; therefore, the date the report was mailed cannot be objectively determined. Section 100.125 (b) states that if a postmark is illegible, the report shall be deemed to have been received on the date received by the Board. However, if the political committee is assessed a fine for the delinquent filing, appeals the fine, and as part of its defense, alleges on an affidavit that the report was mailed more than 72 hours prior to the filing deadline, and this was the first time the committee has made this claim as part of its appeal, the presumptive date of receipt will be rebutted by the testimony contained in the affidavit and the report will be deemed to have been timely received. This affidavit must be signed by the chairman, treasurer, or candidate of the Committee. Ms. Anderson is both the Chairman and Treasurer of record. Ms. Anderson states on the Affidavit that the report was mailed on July 16, 2008, more than 72 hours prior to the filing deadline. Therefore, based upon Section 100.125 of Board rules, I recommend that the appeal be granted.





It has been documented that the Quad Cities area was hit by a violent thunderstorm on July 21<sup>st</sup>. Newspaper accounts state that the number of homes and businesses without power numbered more than 120,000. I recommend that the appeal be granted, due to the problems caused by this powerful thunderstorm which hit the area the morning of the filing deadline.

On the Affidavit, Ms. O'Neal stated that attempts were made to file before the due date and also on the due date; however, they could not get it filed because of computer problems and technical difficulties.

In order to obtain additional information and/or documentation in support of the defense offered by the Treasurer, I contacted Judge O'Neal. I spoke with the Judge, and he had nothing further he wished to offer in defense of the Committee's position in light of the fact that the Committee was Final and, as a first violation, the penalty of \$150 would be stayed. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed. 

**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Delinquently Filing the  
2008 June Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received on July 25, 2008, 4 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$100.

Arthur Gollwitzer III, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Gollwitzer stated that the Committee mailed the 2008 June Semi-Annual Report on July 23, 2008, and it was received by the Board on July 25, 2008. The report was late for two reasons; first it was unintentional; the Committee was acting in good faith. The Committee had received a contribution of \$500 on June 30, 2008. As Treasurer, he immediately attempted to ascertain the full and accurate address and employment information from that donor in order to complete the Schedule A for the report. He was unable to obtain that information until the day he placed the report in the mail to the Board. He believed that sending his report to the Board without complete and accurate information on Schedule A would constitute an untimely submission of their Report. In other words, he chose to delay sending the Report rather than sending in an incomplete Report. He now understands that he could have timely submitted the Report with incomplete information and then supplemented the Report as soon as he obtained the complete and accurate information for inclusion in the Schedule A. He concludes by apologizing for the delay and respectfully requests that the Board reverse its assessment of a \$100 fine against the Committee.

I note that Section 5/9-10 of the Campaign Financing Act requires the treasurer of every political committee to file semi-annual reports of campaign contributions no later than July 20<sup>th</sup>, covering the period from 1/1 through 6/30, and no later than January 20<sup>th</sup>, covering the period from 7/1 through 12/31. The Committee is responsible for obtaining the required information and filing the reports in a timely fashion; filing deadlines cannot be fluid based upon the individual circumstances of each political committee. As to whether a Report may be submitted with incomplete information and then supplemented as soon as the complete information is


included, I refer to Section 100.10(d) of the Board Rules and Regulations as it defines 'filing'. It reads as follows:

d) *Filing*

- 1) *To constitute a "filing" as used in the Election Code and this Part, the statement, report or document must be in apparent and substantial conformity with the requirements of the Election Code. "Apparent and substantial conformity" requires that the filing contain the following:*
  - A) *The signature of the person making the filing;*
  - B) *Completion of all applicable sections of the report; and*
  - C) *Attachment of all appropriate schedules.*
- 2) *Inadvertent error or omission of a de minimus nature in the completion of report, statement or document shall not be deemed to be a "willful failure to file or a willful filing of false or incomplete information" pursuant to Section 9-26 of the Election Code.*

Obviously, what is reasonable would determine whether an error is deemed to be inadvertent or an omission of a *de minimus* nature. In addition, in this case, a second factor also comes into play. The contribution was received by the committee 3 weeks prior to the filing deadline, which seems more than enough time to obtain the necessary information. As a point of clarification, employer and occupation information is not required for a contribution of \$500, but rather for a contribution of more than \$500. I believe this one omission of an address would reasonably be considered *de minimus*, and therefore would not constitute a valid defense. If it were to be considered a valid defense, report deadlines would be seriously undermined.

I therefore recommend that the Appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. As a first violation, the penalty of \$100 is stayed.






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On the following page, please find a proposed Standing Order that would authorize any Board Member(s) to submit as part of the official record of any case before the Board, a statement of explanation of his or her vote on any matter, without further authorization of the Board.

To avoid a repetition of the situation that necessitated this Order, there are a couple of options that the Board may wish to consider. Keep in mind that this situation would only arise where the recommendation of both the Hearing Officer and the General Counsel is to find the complaint filed on justifiable grounds and to set the matter for public hearing, and where four Members reject said recommendation, causing a tie vote. Should either the Hearing Officer or General Counsel recommend that the complaint be dismissed, the four members could simply adopt that recommendation as the basis for their vote.

The first option would be for the Members voting to reject said recommendations to state orally at the time of their vote, the reasons for voting to reject. They could also submit for the record a written statement of reasons within 30 days of their vote (assuming the Board adopts the above Standing Order).

The second option would be to adopt a policy that in the event that the recommendation of the Hearing Officer and General Counsel is to find justifiable grounds and to order a public hearing, the Hearing Officer would be directed to require the Respondent to submit, subsequent to their receipt of the recommendations and prior to the Board's consideration of same, a brief or statement outlining their objections to the Hearing Officer's and General Counsel's recommendation. Then in the event of a tie vote, the four dissenting members could simply adopt such brief or statement as the basis for their dissent.

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The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) at its September meeting rejected the above Rulemaking, stating that it exceeded the statutory authority of the State Board of Elections, and that if such a provision were to be enacted, it should be done through legislation. Previously, JCAR staff had indicated that if the Rulemaking were amended so as to be limited to election authorities operating under the provisions of Article 4 of the Election Code (counties with a population under 500,000) in which there currently exists authority to rely on "other sources, regarding the removal of registered voters" [10 ILCS 5/4-16], this likely would satisfy JCAR's objection. JCAR staff also said that the confirmation from the funeral director should be written and not verbal.

If the Board does not wish to amend the Rulemaking per JCAR's objection, they may withdraw the same. I have included a copy of the proposed Rulemaking and JCAR's rejection documentation on the following pages for your reference.

- b) No voter registration may be canceled without following the procedures and providing the notice of suspension or cancellation required by Section 8(a) through (d) of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993. The Voter Registration Application or the Voter Registration Card of an inactive voter who has not voted in two consecutive general federal elections shall be canceled at the completion of procedures set forth in Section 8(d) of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, provided that, while such procedures are pending, the voter has taken no action specified in the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 to restore his or her name to active voter status.
- c) An election authority shall cancel the Voter Registration Application or Voter Registration Card of a voter upon receipt of a request in writing from the voter to do so. A written acknowledgment by the voter that he or she has changed residence to a place beyond the jurisdiction of the election authority or an attempt to register in another jurisdiction shall be deemed a request to cancel the voter registration.
- d) A voter's registration shall be canceled upon the election authority's receipt of:
  - 1) a notice from the State Board of Elections that the voter has been incarcerated in a United States correctional facility by reason of conviction;
  - 2) a certified notice from the-a state department of corrections or a sheriff of a county in the United States that the voter has been incarcerated in a state or county correctional facility, as the case may be, if:
    - A) the certified notice states on its face that the incarceration is a result of a criminal conviction and the crime of which the voter has been convicted; or
    - B) the certified notice is accompanied by a certified judgment of conviction or equivalent document issued by the court in which the conviction was obtained;
  - 3) a certified copy of a judgment of conviction from a court of record that the voter has been convicted of a crime in which it was found that the voter

- 4) a certified copy of a final judgment order of a court of record or a certified copy of the final determination of an administrative tribunal having jurisdiction in which it was found that the voter lacked the requisite qualifications to be a voter in Illinois either at the time of entry of the judgment or determination, or at the time application was made to become a voter; or
- 5) a certified copy of the voter's death certificate or equivalent document issued by a department of vital records, wherever situated, or, in the alternative, an obituary listing the name of the decedent contained in a newspaper having a general circulation throughout the municipality or county in which the decedent lived immediately prior to death. In the event an obituary is used, confirmation of its authenticity and accuracy must be obtained via a written confirmation by a funeral director of the funeral home or other location at which the memorial service, wake, funeral or similar service was held.
