CHICAGO, IL, March 13, 2014 -- The Illinois State Board of Elections has set up a special Election Day “hotline” telephone numbers to assist voters at Tuesday’s March 18, 2014 General Primary Election.

The Chicago area “hotline” telephone number is (312) 814-6466. For downstate voters, calls will be taken at the board’s Springfield office at (217) 782-4141. The telephone number for the hearing impaired is (217) 782-1518.

Election Specialists will be available Election Day from 6:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. in Chicago and from 5:30 a.m. until Midnight in Springfield to answer vote questions and respond to complaints.

Voters in the March 18, 2014, General Primary Election will nominate candidates for United States Senator, Governor/Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller, Treasurer, Representatives in Congress, State Senators and Representatives in the General Assembly and certain County Officers and Judges. Also, some political party officials will be elected.

In a primary election, an Illinois voter can vote for candidates of one party only. Voters, however, may request a nonpartisan ballot to vote for any public question which happens to be on the ballot in their precinct. In that case, a voter would not have to declare a party affiliation.

Questions regarding [voters registration](#) information or [polling place locations](#) should be referred to the office of the Cook County Clerk or Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, or other appropriate election authority.
