INTRODUCTION

The Illinois State Board of Elections is pleased to present its sixth report which summarizes the flow of dollars in political campaigns in Illinois. This report follows our 1998 study by reviewing contests in the 2000 election cycle. Again we have attempted to paint the "big picture" in an effort to bring some meaningful analysis to the large sums of money spent to elect candidates to public office in this state. We have also added some new features which we hope will enhance the report.

The races covered in this review include all contests for Judicial offices and the Illinois General Assembly. The information is based on public reports filed with the Board by these state committees as required by law. Everything contained in this report represents information that could have been accessed by any member of the public.

The Board appreciated the warm response and helpful suggestions subsequent to the publication of its first five reports. We hope this new and improved product will enhance the current debate on how to regulate money in political campaigns for public office.

We welcome your comments and suggestions at any time.

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GLOSSARY OF TERMS

"State political committee" means the candidate or any individual, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or any other organization or group of persons which --

(a) accepts contributions or grants or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the Secretary of State;

(b) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 in support of or in opposition to any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors of an area encompassing more than one county; or

(c) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 and has as its primary purpose the furtherance of governmental, political or social values, is organized on a not-for-profit basis, and which publicly endorses or publicly opposes a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the Secretary of State.

"Local political committee" means the candidate or any individual, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or any other organization or group of persons which --

(a) accepts contributions or grants or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the county clerk, or on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for election to the office of ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population.

(b) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 in support of or in opposition to any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors of an area encompassing no more than one county; or

(c) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12 month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 and has as its primary purpose the furtherance of governmental, political or social values, is organized on a not-for-profit basis, and which publicly endorses or publicly opposes a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the county clerk or a candidate or candidates for the office of ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population.

"Candidate" means any person who seeks nomination for election, election to or retention in public office, or any person who seeks election as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, whether or not such person is elected. A person seeks nomination for election, election or retention if he (1) takes the action necessary under the laws of this State to attempt to qualify for nomination for election, election to or retention in public office, or election as ward or township committeeman in counties 3,000,000 or more population, or (2) receives contributions or makes expenditures, or gives consent for any other person to receive contributions or make expenditures with a view to bringing about his nomination for election to or retention in public office, or his or her election as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population.

"Contribution" means a gift, subscription, donation, dues, loans, advance, or deposit of money or anything of value, knowingly received in connection with the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office, in connection with the election of any person as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, or in connection with a question of public policy.

"In-kind Contribution" consists of a receipt of goods or services in lieu of a monetary contribution.

"Expenditure" means a payment, distribution, purchase, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value, in connection with the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office, in connection with the election of any person as ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population, or in connection with any question of public policy.

"Transfer of funds" means any conveyance of money or the purchase of tickets made in connection with the nomination for election, election or retention of any person to or in public office or in connection with any question of public policy from one political committee to another political committee.

AGP@ is the General Primary which was March 21, 2000. The Semi Annual Report, covering the period January 1, 2000 through June 30, 2000, was used to compile data for the General Primary.

AGE@ is the General Election which was November 7, 2000. The Semi Annual Report, covering the period July 1, 2000 through December 31, 2000, was used to compile data for the General Election.

The following pages represent aggregate totals showing money available and expended for Democrat, Republican and miscellaneous political committees, and these terms are defined as follows:

Available - the sum of beginning funds available and total receipts for the reporting period, thus representing the total amount of money a political committee had at its disposal.

Expended - the total amount spent by a political committee during the reporting period.

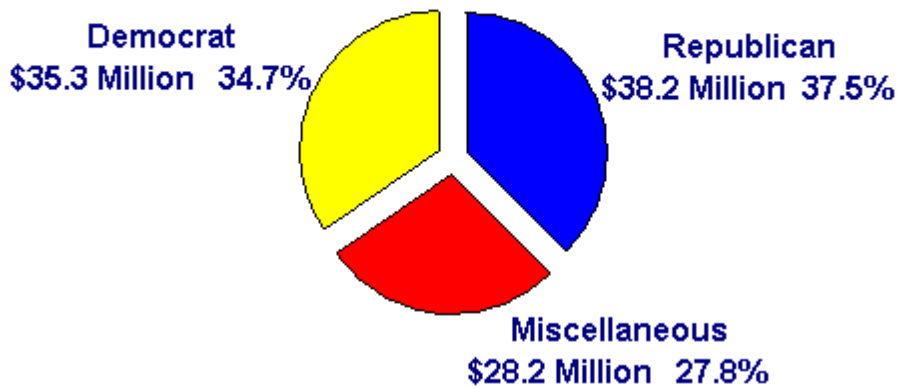
Democrat - political committee which has indicated on its statement of organization an affiliation with the Democrat party. (672 political committees-GP, 792 political committees-GE)

Republican - political committee which has indicated on its statement of organization an affiliation with the Republican party. (659 political committees-GP, 739 political committees-GE)

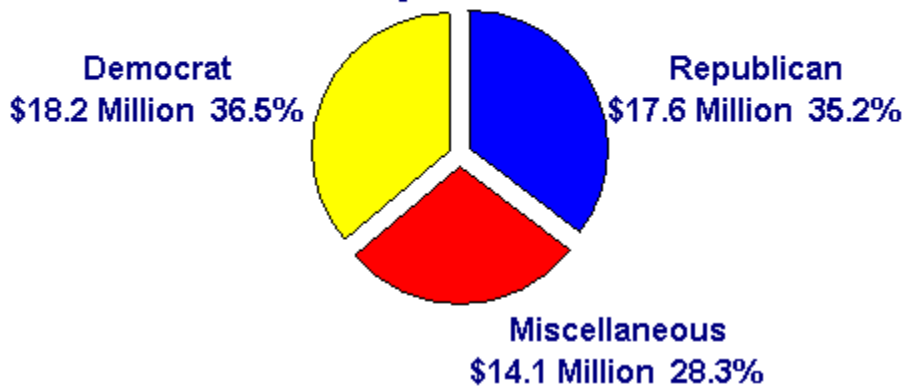
Miscellaneous - political committee which has indicated no direct affiliation with the Democrat or Republican party. (622 political committees-GP, 733 political committees-GE)

Available

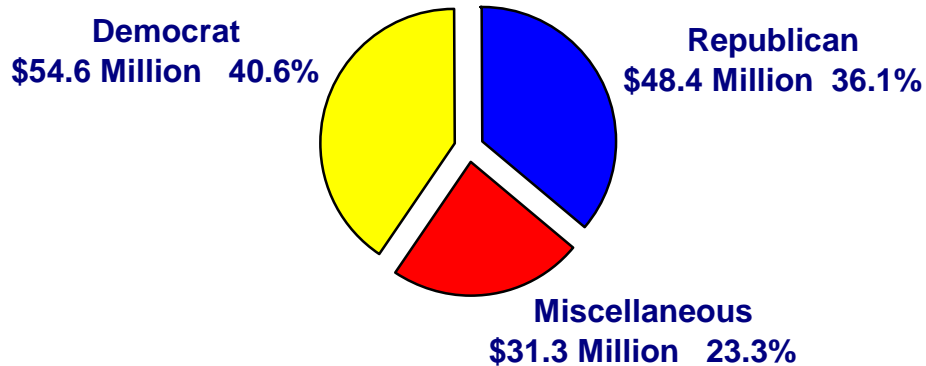


Expended

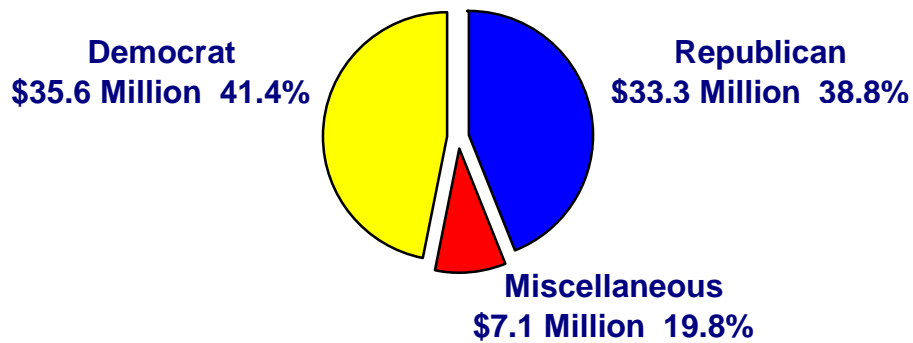


Political Parties 2000 General Election

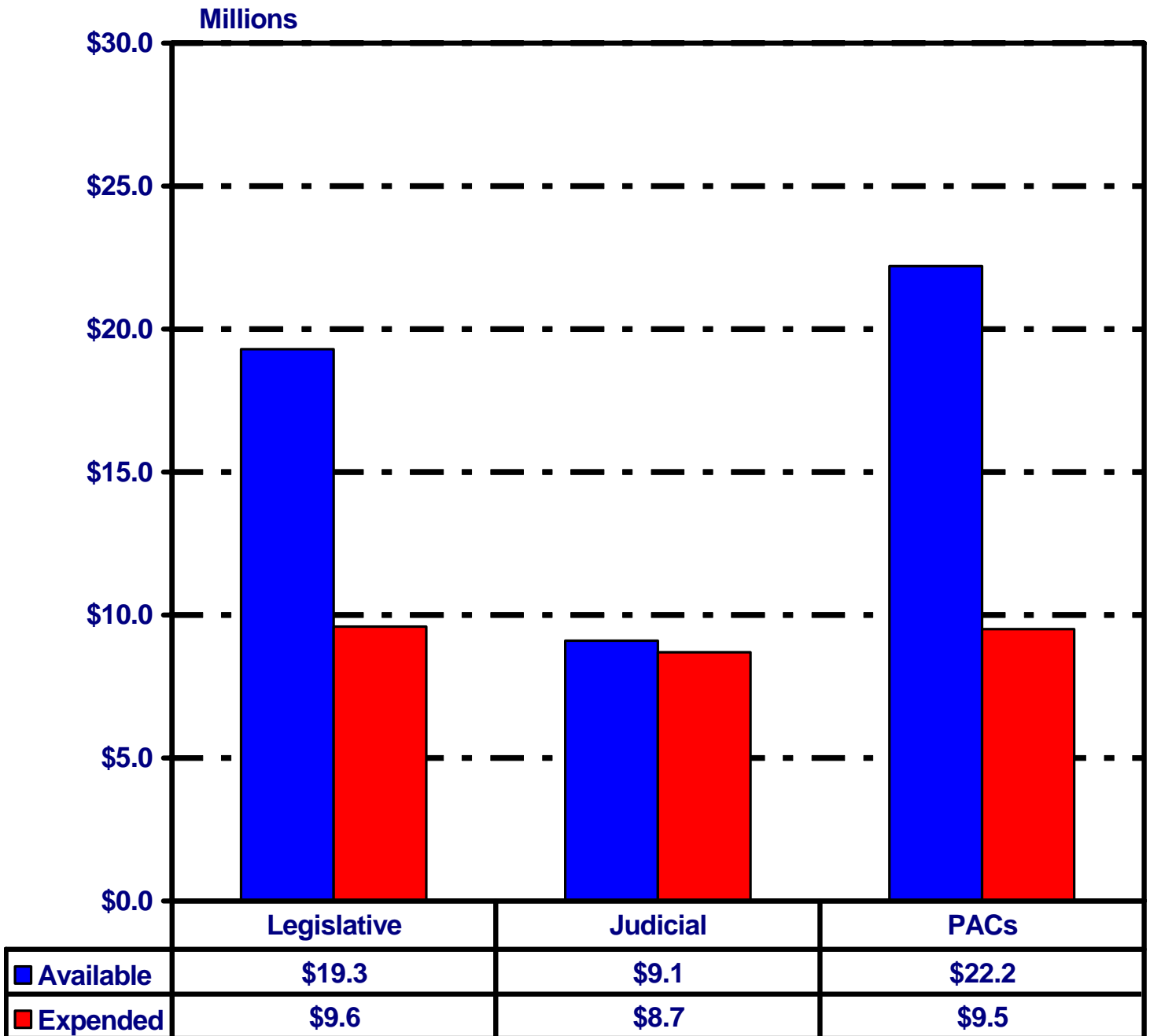
Judicial Committees

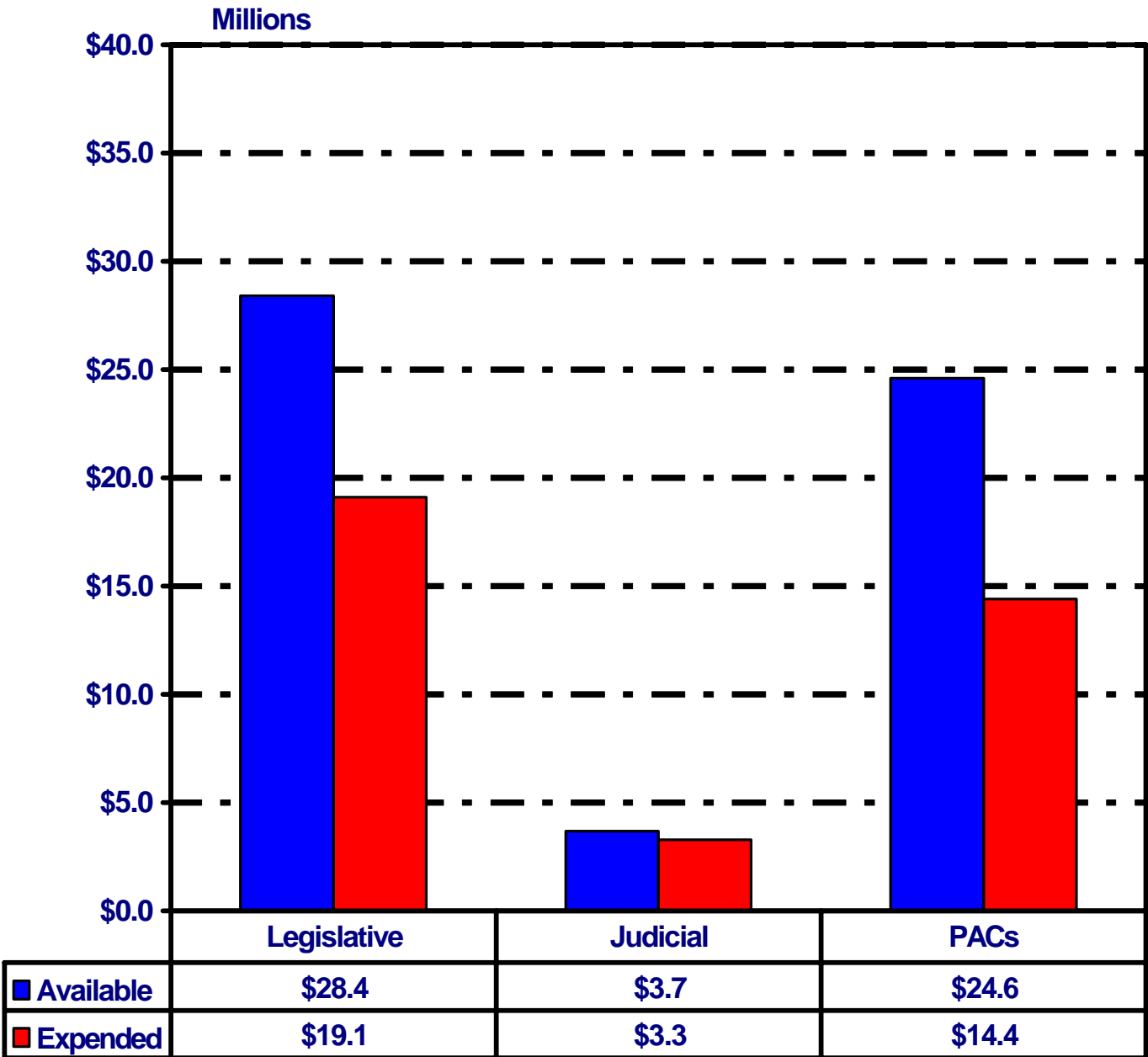

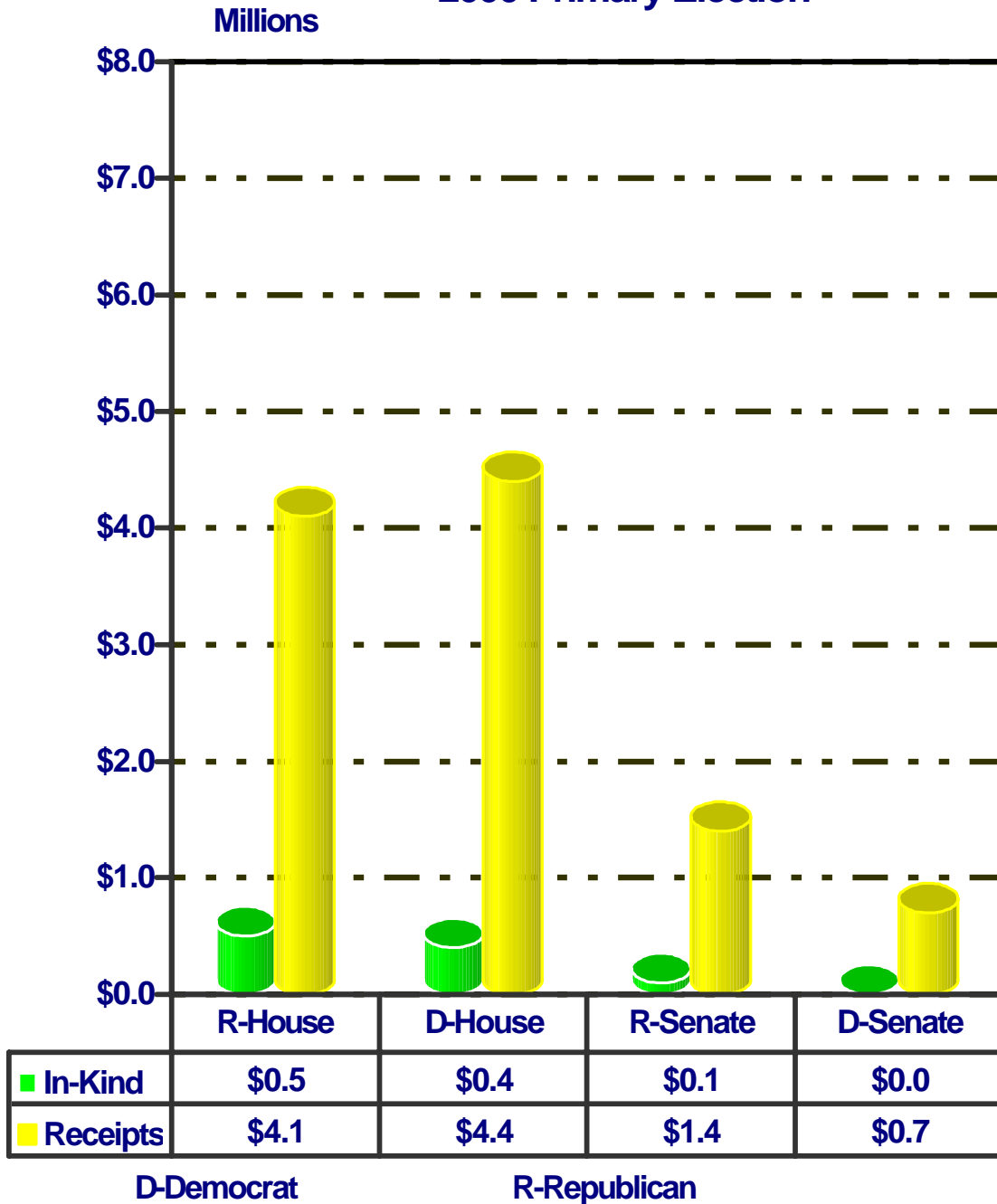
RECEIPTS AND IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

The receipt and in-kind contributions graph illustrates the amount of in-kind contributions received by House and Senate candidates. In-kind contributions are receipts of goods and services rather than hard dollars.

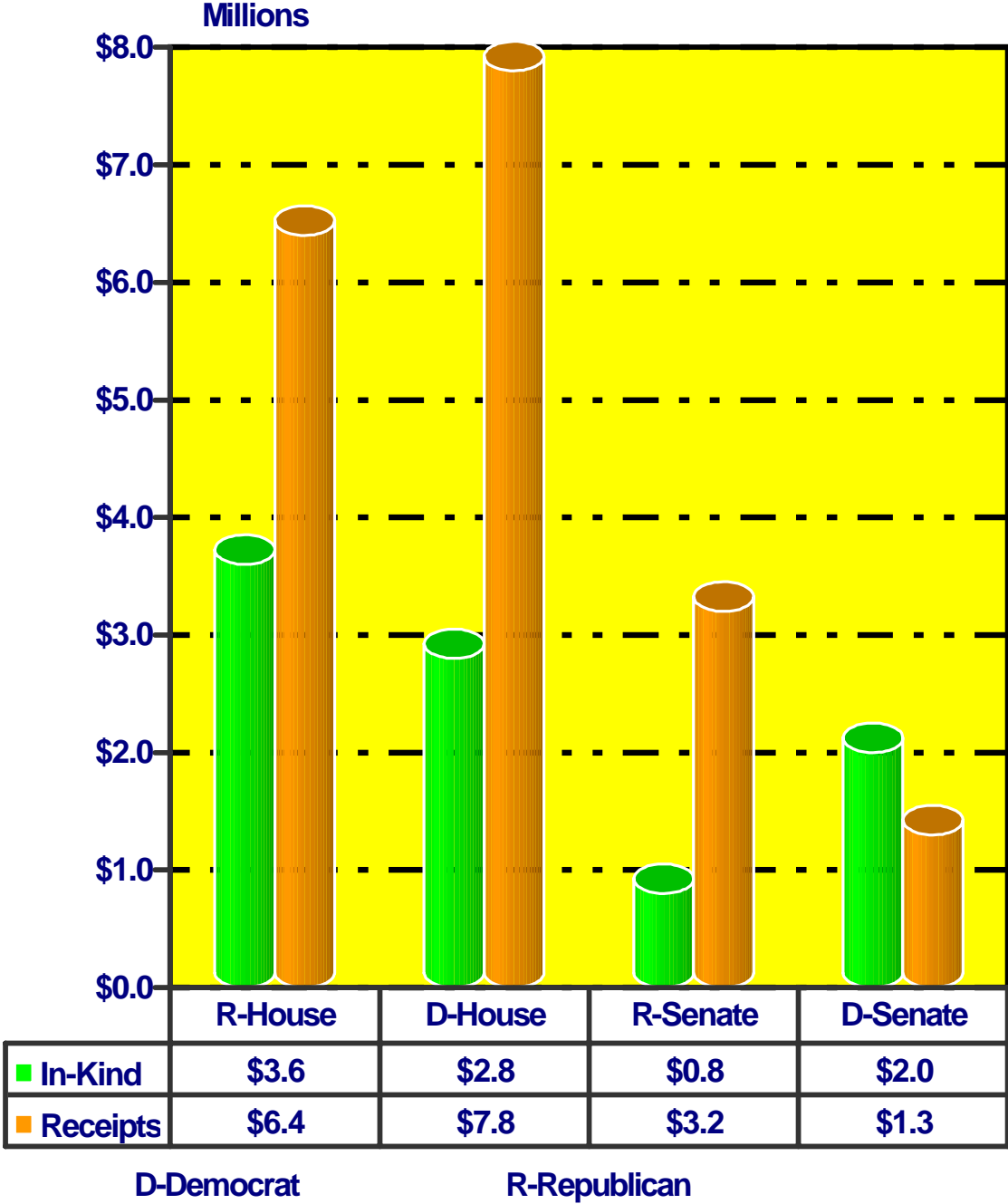
The expenditure and transfer out graph illustrates the monetary donations made by House and Senate candidates as opposed to the regular expenditures of the committees.

The purpose of comparing in-kind contributions to transfers out (monetary donations) is to explore the difference between the two, based upon who decides how such contributions shall be used. Monetary donations can be used as the candidates deem necessary, but decisions regarding in-kind contributions (i.e. printing, radio or TV spots) are made by the committees making the donations in conjunction with the candidates receiving the in-kind contributions.

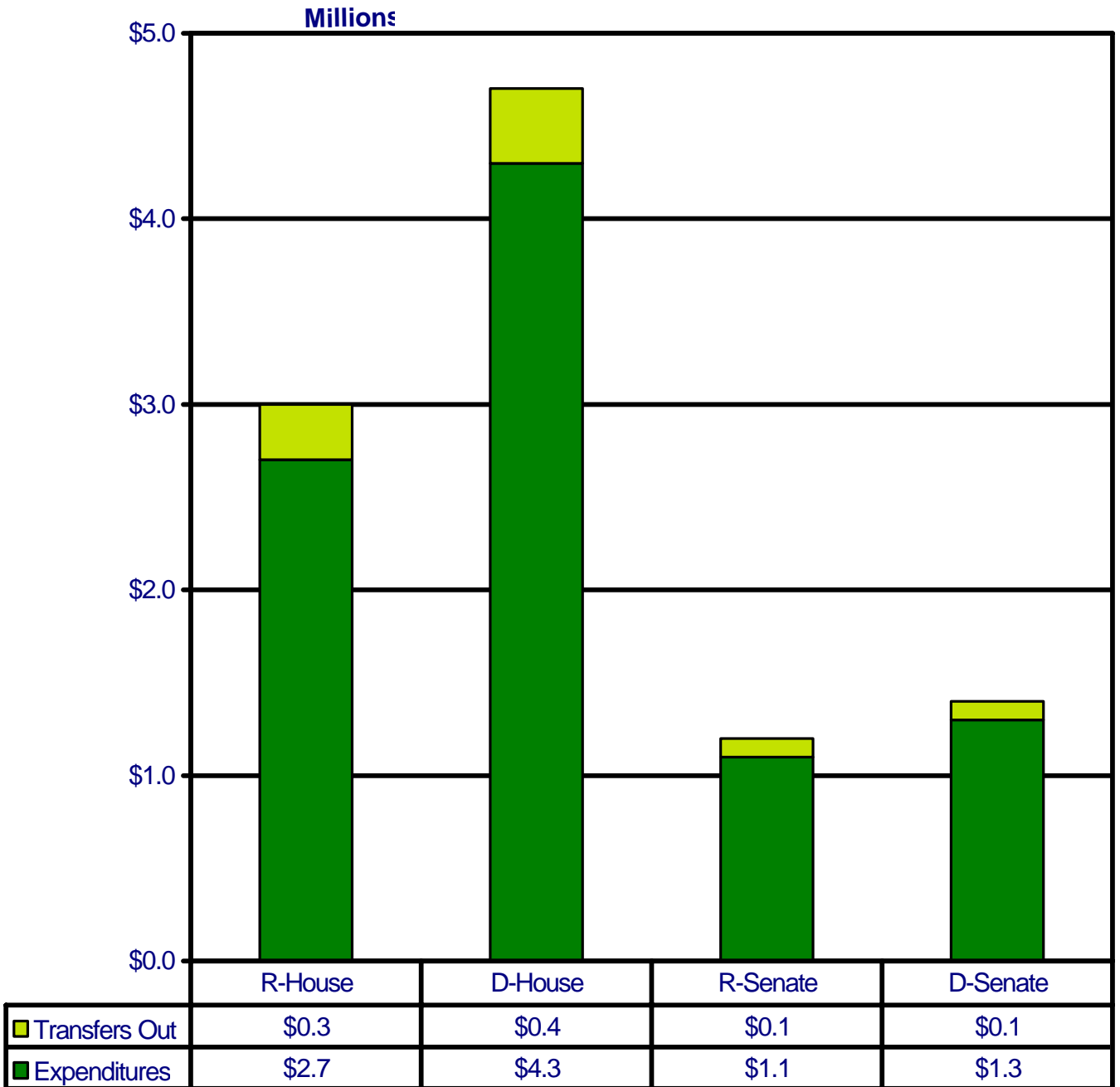
Receipts and In-Kind Contributions 2000 Primary Election



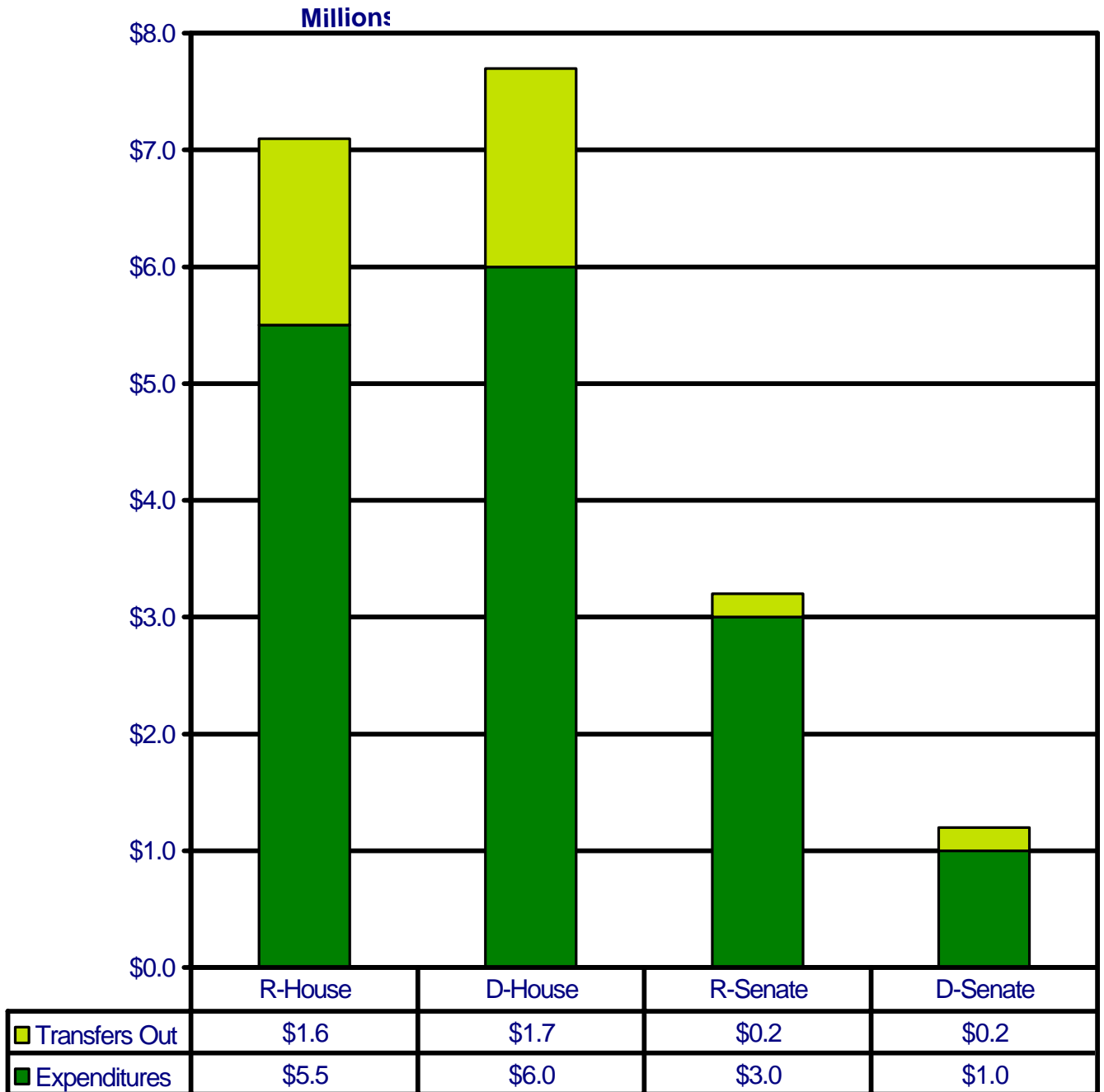
Receipts and In-Kind Contributions 2000 General Election

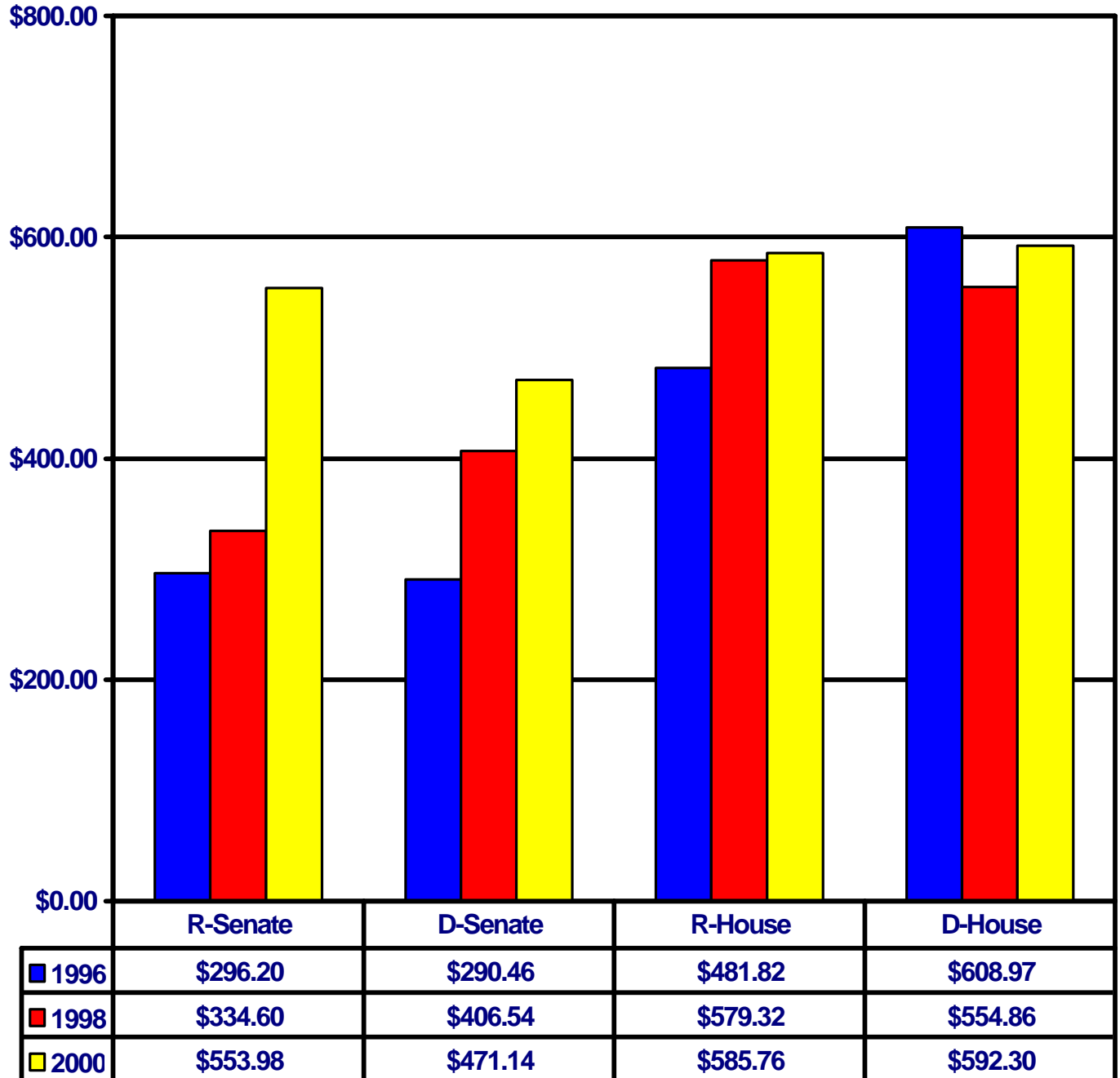

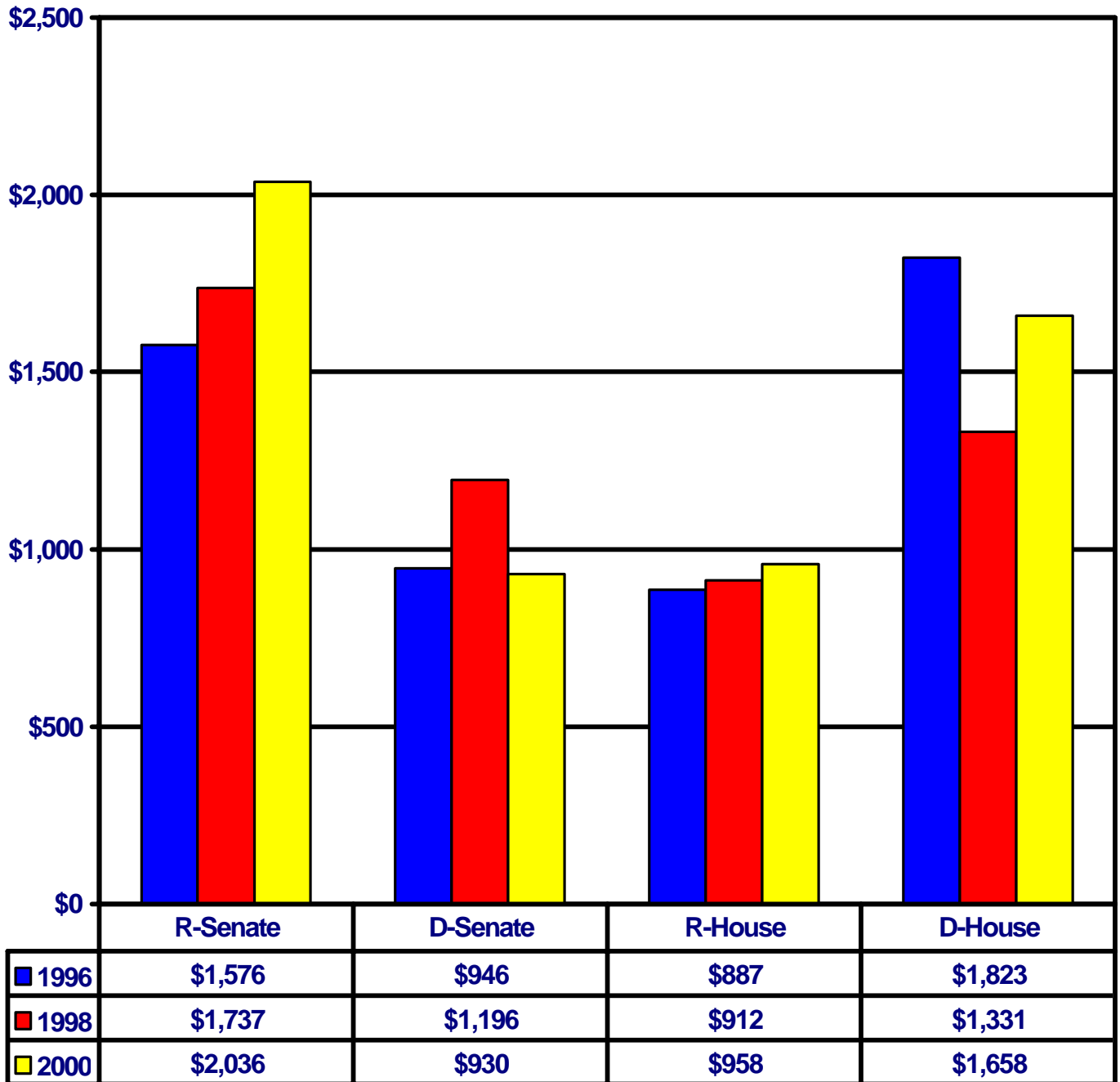
AVERAGE ELECTION COST - 2000 GENERAL ELECTION

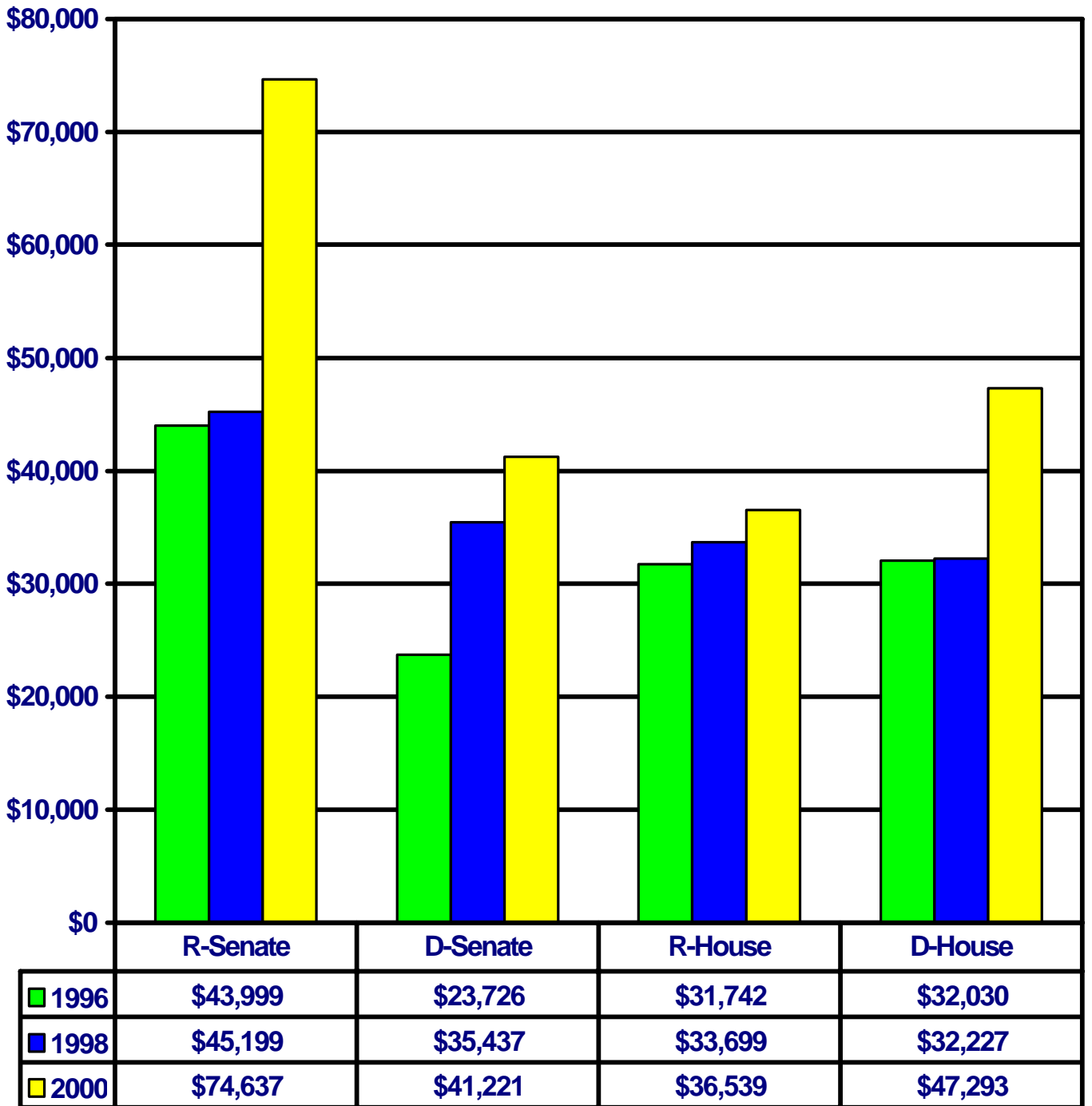
Average Individual Contribution Received General Election



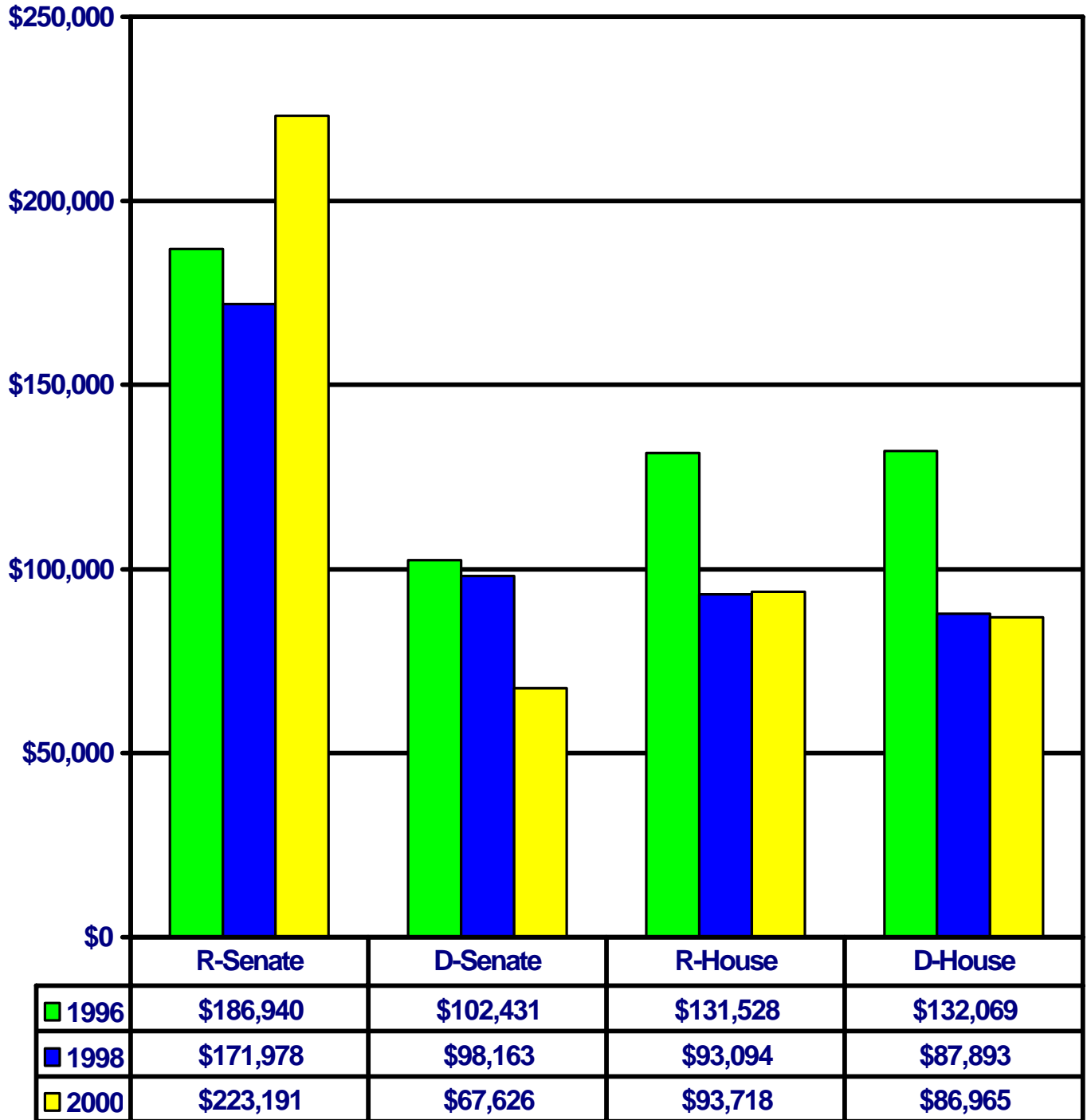
Average PAC Contribution Received General Election

Average Election Cost General Election



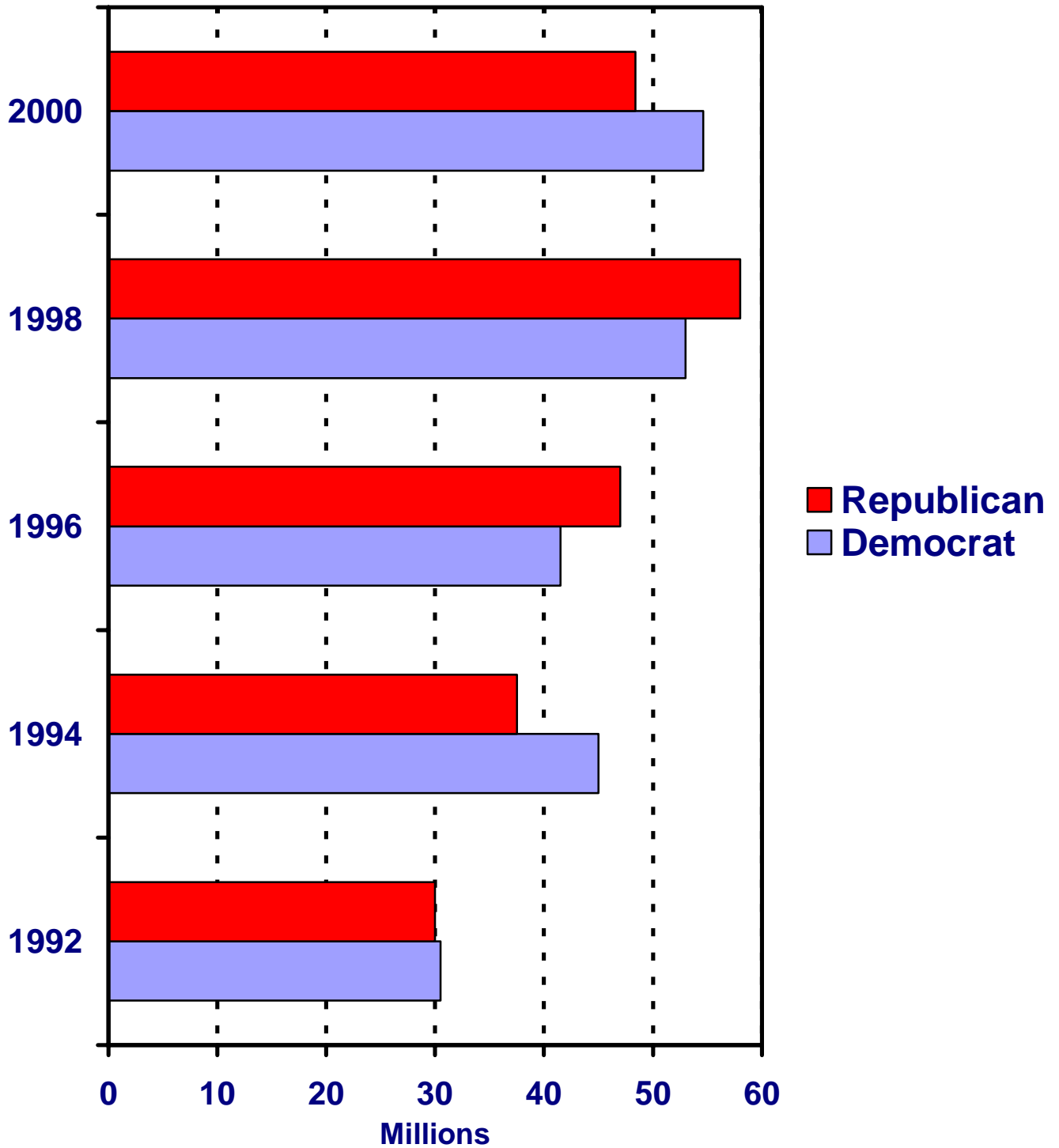
The following graph represents money available for Democrat and Republican political committees, and these terms are defined as follows.

REPUBLICAN - Political committee which has indicated on its statement of organization an affiliation with the Republican Party. (739 political committees-GE)

Political Parties Available - General Elections



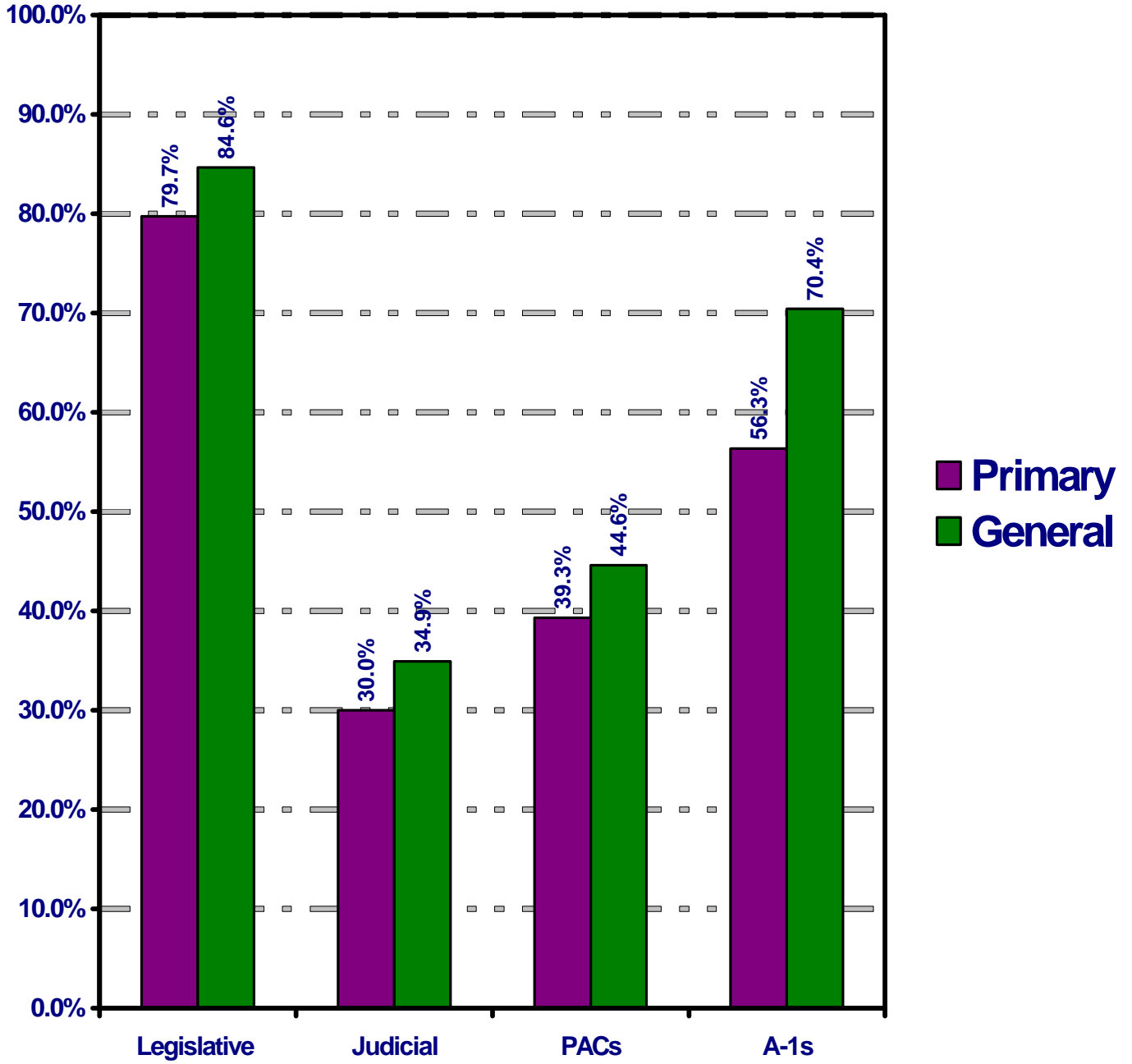
ELECTRONIC FILING

Effective with respect to Semi Annual Reports covering the last six months of 1999, all active committees that during a reporting period had at any time balances or accumulations of contributions of \$25,000 or more, made aggregate expenditures of \$25,000 or more, or received loans of an aggregate of \$25,000 or more were required under the Illinois Campaign Finance Act to file disclosure reports electronically.

The State Board of Elections provides such committees with filing software at no charge. All reports filed electronically are promptly made available to the public by means of a searchable database on the Board's website, www.elections.state.il.us.

The graph on the next page shows the percentage of Legislative and Judicial Committees, as well as Political Action Committees, that filed their 2000 disclosure reports electronically. It also shows the percentage of A-1 reports (identifying loans or contributions in an aggregate of \$500 or more from single sources within 30 days of an election) that were filed electronically in 2000. The A-1 data references all political committees.

The following pages portray aggregate campaign finance data for all General Assembly races on the 2000 Illinois ballot. Several explanations are needed before reviewing the data.

A district showing only one Republican or one Democrat represents an uncontested race in the general election.

In-kind contributions have been added to expenditures to derive a more accurate expenditure per vote. An in-kind represents an expenditure made by another on behalf of the candidate.

Representative Districts 22 and 46 have had expenditures reduced by the amounts donated to or spent on the behalf of other candidates. The adjustment was made to reflect the leadership positions of the candidates in the above districts and more accurately reflect expenditures per vote in these districts.

Candidates with no political committee on file are not included. These candidates collected/expended no more than \$3,000, which is the statutory threshold for reporting in Illinois.
