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PREFACE

The 2005 Calendar contains the specific date entries required in the nomination and/or election of officials of municipalities, townships, libraries, parks, school districts and other special purpose districts.

The following definitions are employed as related to this calendar.

Election Authority – the County Clerk, the Municipal Board of Election Commissioners, or the County Board of Election Commissioners.

Local Election Official – the clerk or secretary of a unit of local government or a school district.

Business Day – any day in which the office of an election authority, local election official or the State Board of Elections is open to the public for a minimum of seven hours.

(10 ILCS 5/1-3)

Filing and Registration Dates

If the first or last day fixed by law to do any act required or allowed by this Code falls on a State holiday or a Saturday or a Sunday, the period shall extend through the first business day next following the day otherwise fixed as the first or last day, irrespective of whether any election authority or local election official conducts business on the State holiday, Saturday, or Sunday.

[10 ILCS 5/1-6(a)]

For the purposes of this Section, “State holiday” means New Year’s Day, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.’s Birthday, Lincoln’s Birthday, President’s Day, Casimir Pulaski’s Birthday, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans’ Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and any other day from time to time declared by the President of the United States or the Governor of Illinois to be a day during which the agencies of the State of Illinois that are ordinarily open to do business with the public shall be closed for business.

[10 ILCS 5/1-6(b)]

Number of Signatures – the specific number of signatures required on a nominating petition as calculated by the election authority or the local election official for an individual to be a candidate for a specific office. To receive specific signature requirements, candidates should contact the election authority or local election official who is responsible for receiving the filing of the petition for nomination and/or election to office.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2004

First day to circulate nomination papers (**must include original sheets signed by voters and circulators**) for established political party and nonpartisan candidates who file DECEMBER 6 THROUGH DECEMBER 13, 2004 – 90 days preceding the last day to file such papers.
(10 ILCS 5/7-10, 7-12, 10-4, 10-6)

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2004

First day notice of intention to file a petition to create a political subdivision whose officers are to be elected, rather than appointed, may be published in a newspaper within the proposed political subdivision, or if none, in a newspaper of general circulation within the proposed territory.
(10 ILCS 5/28-2)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2004

Last day notice of intention to file a petition to create a political subdivision whose officers are to be elected rather than appointed, may be published in a newspaper within the proposed political subdivision, or if none, in a newspaper of general circulation within the proposed territory.
(10 ILCS 5/28-2)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2004

Last day to file petition (**must contain original sheets signed by voters and circulators**) to create a political subdivision with the appropriate circuit court clerk.
(10 ILCS 5/28-2)

NOTE: Objections can be filed on or before the date of the hearing with the appropriate circuit court clerk.
(10 ILCS 5/28-4)

NOTE: If initial officers are to be elected at the election for creation of a new unit of government, candidates for such offices shall file nomination papers 78-71 days before such election – December 6 - 13, 2004
(10 ILCS 5/10-6)

NOTE: The circuit court clerk shall publish the hearing date for a public policy petition filed in his/her office not later than 14 days after the petition is actually filed, but at least 5 days before the actual hearing (final orders within 7 days of hearing).

NOTE: See the specific statute governing the unit of local government to be established for filing procedures.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2004

Last day for municipal clerk to certify to the election authority the municipal ordinance providing for the nomination of municipal officers by party primary (municipalities under 5,000 population).
(10 ILCS 5/7-1)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2004

Last day for the township central committee in counties having a population of over 3,000,000 and townships having a population of over 15,000 in counties of less than 3,000,000 population to notify the appropriate election authority that their specific party will nominate candidates by primary election.
(10 ILCS 5/7-1; 60 ILCS 1/45-55)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2004

Last day State Board of Elections shall certify to the proper election authority a list of facilities licensed or certified under the Nursing home Care Reform Act of 1979. The list shall indicate bed capacity and the Chief Administrator of each facility.
(10 ILCS 5/19-12.2)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2004

Last day to file objections to petition to create a political subdivision in the office of the circuit clerk.
(10 ILCS 5/10-8, 28-4)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 30, 2004

Last day county central committee chairmen shall submit a list to the election authority of applicants for additional deputy registrars.
(10 ILCS 5/4-6.2, 5-16.2, 6-50.2)

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2004

Beginning of two-year term of all deputy registrars, except precinct committeemen who began their two-year term on the date of the county convention following their election.
(10 ILCS 5/4-6.2, 5-16.2, 6-50.2)

MONDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2004

First day for filing in the office of the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners **original** nomination papers (**must contain original sheets signed by voters and circulators**) for: 1) established political parties in municipalities over 5,000 population; 2) townships in Cook County where the township central committee has approved a primary; 3) municipalities under 5,000 which by ordinance nominate by primary; 4) villages and municipalities which by referendum conduct a partisan or nonpartisan primary; 5) municipalities which have adopted the commission or managerial form of government conduct nonpartisan primaries, and 6) the City of Chicago (if a special election is required due to a vacancy).

[10 ILCS 5/7-1, 7-12(3), 10-6(4); 60 ILCS 1/45-55; 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-60, 3.1-25-65, 20/21-5, 21-12, 21-25]

NOTE: Filing period does not cover candidates for park, library, school, community college, educational service region trustees, or fire protection district offices.

NOTE: Seven (7) days written notice of the time and place for conducting a lottery shall be given when 2 or more petitions are received simultaneously for the same office and party or nonpartisan candidates, as of the opening hour of the filing period, December 6, 2004. Notice shall be given by the local election official to the chairman of each political party and to each organization of citizens within the election jurisdiction entitled to have pollwatchers present at the last consolidated election. Notice must be posted at the entrance of the office. (The SBE recommends notifying all candidates involved in the lottery.)

MONDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2004

Last day for filing of petitions (**must contain original sheets signed by voters and circulators**) for referenda for the submission of questions of public policy (local). (EXCEPTION: proposition to create a political subdivision or referenda initiated under the Liquor Control Act) (10 ILCS 5/28-2, 28-6, 28-7)

NOTE: Petitions to initiate backdoor referenda must be filed under the deadline specified in the specific statute authorizing the referenda, but in no case later than 78 days prior to the ensuing election.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 13, 2004

Last day to file objections to petitions for referenda for the submission of questions of public policy (local). (EXCEPTION: proposition to create a political subdivision and referenda initiated under the provisions of the Liquor Control Act). (10 ILCS 5/10-8, 28-4)

NOTE: For procedures on objections see page 34.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 13, 2004

Last day for filing in the office of the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners **original** nomination papers (**must contain original sheets signed by voters and circulators**) for: 1) established political parties in municipalities over 5,000 population; 2) townships in Cook County where the township central committee has approved a primary; 3) municipalities under 5,000 population which by ordinance nominate by primary; 4) villages and municipalities which by referendum conduct a partisan or nonpartisan primary; 5) municipalities which have adopted the commission or managerial form of government which conduct nonpartisan primaries, and 6) the City of Chicago (if a special election is required due to a vacancy). [10 ILCS 5/7-1, 7-12(3), 10-6(4); 60 ILCS 1/45-55; and 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-60, 3.1-25-65, 20/21-5, 21-12, 21-25]

NOTE: Filing period does not cover candidates for park, library, school, community college, educational service region trustees, or fire protection district offices.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 13, 2004

Last day for filing a Statement of Economic Interests with the county clerk required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. The **receipt** must be filed on or before this date with the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners who received the nomination papers. [5 ILCS 420/4A-105; 10 ILCS 5/7-12(8), 10-5]

MONDAY, DECEMBER 20, 2004

Last day for an individual who has filed nomination papers for 2 or more **incompatible** offices to withdraw from all but one of the offices with the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners.

[10 ILCS 5/7-12(9), 10-7]

MONDAY, DECEMBER 20, 2004

Last day for local governing boards to adopt a resolution or ordinance to allow a binding public question to appear on the ballot. (EXCEPTION: County, Municipal, Township and Park District Boards may place advisory referenda on the ballot by resolution)

(10 ILCS 5/28-2; 55 ILCS 5/5-1005.5; 60 ILCS 1/80-80; 65 ILCS 5/3.1-40-60; 70 ILCS 1205/8-30)

MONDAY, DECEMBER 20, 2004

Last day for filing objections to nomination papers of established political party and nonpartisan candidates in the office of the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners.

(10 ILCS 5/7-12.1, 10-8)

NOTE: For procedures on objections see page 34.

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 22, 2004

Last day for the election authority to publish a notice that mechanical or electronic voting devices will be used for the first time at the Consolidated Primary Election.

(10 ILCS 5/24-1.1, 24A-3, 24B-3, 24C-3)

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 22, 2004

Last day lottery shall be conducted by the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners when 2 or more petitions are received simultaneously for the same office and party or nonpartisan candidates as of the opening hour of the filing period (December 6, 2004).

[10 ILCS 5/7-12(6), 10-6.2]

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 23, 2004

Last day for the local election official to certify offices and candidates to the election authority.

(10 ILCS 5/7-13.1, 10-15)

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 23, 2004

Last day for the circuit court clerk and the local election official to certify any question of public policy to the election authority having jurisdiction over the political subdivision.

(10 ILCS 5/28-5)

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 23, 2004

Last day to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate to force a primary election for any office for which the nomination is uncontested in the office of the election official with whom nomination papers for such office are filed.

[10 ILCS 5/7-5(d); 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-20, 4-3-5]

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 23, 2004

Last day for candidates of established political parties and nonpartisan candidates to file withdrawal of nomination papers in the office of the local election official or Board of Election Commissioners, excluding aldermanic candidates in the City of Chicago.

[10 ILCS 5/7-12(9), 10-7; 65 ILCS 20/21-29]

MONDAY, DECEMBER 27, 2004

Last day the election authority shall provide public notice, calculated to reach the elderly and handicapped voters, of the registration and voting aids under the Federal Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act, and of the availability of assistance in marking the ballot and procedures for voting by absentee ballot.

(10 ILCS 5/1-6, 7-15)

MONDAY, DECEMBER 27, 2004

Last day for election authorities to submit computer disk containing voter registration information to the State Board of Elections.

(10 ILCS 5/1-6, 4-8, 5-7, 6-35)

MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 2005

First day for citizens of the United States temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of the United States who are not registered but otherwise qualified to vote and who expect to be absent from their county of residence on election day to make simultaneous application to the election authority having jurisdiction over his/her precinct of residence for absentee registration and an absentee ballot*.

(10 ILCS 5/20-2.1, 20-3)

NOTE: Absentee registration shall be required for citizens temporarily residing outside the United States in order to vote.

NOTE: *Under the provisions of HAVA, a FPCA form entitles the applicant to receive a ballot through 2 federal general elections regardless of when submitted.

MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 2005

First day any voter who is a member of the United States Service and his spouse and dependents of voting age who expect to be absent from their county of residence on election day to make a written application (may make application via facsimile machine or other method of electronic transmission) for an official ballot to the election authority having jurisdiction over their residence*.

(10 ILCS 5/20-2, 20-2.3, 20-3)

NOTE: No registration shall be required in order to vote pursuant to this Section.

NOTE: *Under the provisions of HAVA, a FPCA form entitles the applicant to receive a ballot through 2 federal general elections regardless of when submitted.

MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 2005

Last day for election authorities to provide to each county chairman or his representative, precinct lists prepared for the 2004 General Election marked to indicate which registrants voted at the General Election.

(10 ILCS 5/4-11, 5-14, 6-60)

MONDAY, JANUARY 10, 2005

Last day for the election authority to have in his office a sufficient number of ballots printed and available for mailing to persons in the United States Service or their spouse or dependents of voting age and citizens temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of the United States.
(10 ILCS 5/7-16, 16-5.01)

THURSDAY, JANUARY 13, 2005

First day for any registered voter presently within the confines of the United States, who expects to be absent from his/her county of residence on election day, to make application **by mail or in person** to the election authority for an official ballot.
(10 ILCS 5/19-2)

NOTE: MOST FIRST TIME VOTERS WHO REGISTER BY MAIL MUST VOTE IN PERSON, EITHER IN PERSON ABSENTEE VOTING (AT THE OFFICE OF THE ELECTION AUTHORITY OR AUTHORIZED MUNICIPAL, TOWNSHIP OR ROAD DISTRICT CLERK), AS A HOSPITALIZED OR NURSING HOME VOTER, OR AT THE PRECINCT POLLING PLACE. For exceptions, see 42 USC 1973gg-4(c) and SBE Rule, Title 26, Section 216.90.

**NOTE: Certain situations other than absence from county of residence also permit application for absentee ballot to be made.
(10 ILCS 5/19-3)**

THURSDAY, JANUARY 13, 2005

Last day for civic organizations (which have as a stated purpose the investigation or prosecution of election fraud) and proposition proponents or opponents to register their names and addresses and the names and addresses of their principal officers with the proper election authority if the organization wants to qualify for pollwatchers at the Consolidated Primary Election.
(10 ILCS 5/7-34)

THURSDAY, JANUARY 13, 2005

Last day for election authority to mail by nonforwardable mail to qualified elector who has filed "Temporarily Absent Student Notice", an application for Absent Student Ballot.
(10 ILCS 5/19-4, 19-12.3)

SUNDAY, JANUARY 23, 2005

MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 2005

TUESDAY, JANUARY 25, 2005

Dates for filing Lodging House Affidavits with Board of Election Commissioners. (*The National Voter Registration Act of 1993 may prohibit enforcement of this provision.*)
(10 ILCS 5/6-56)

MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 2005

First day for election authority to publish notice of primary and notice of referenda. Notice must include the color of the primary ballots, the polling hours, the offices for which candidates will be nominated and the political parties. (Must include list of precinct polling addresses unless published separately at least 10 days prior to the Consolidated Primary.) *The election authority shall post a copy of the notice at the principal office of the election authority. The local election official shall also post a copy of the notice at the principal office of the political or governmental subdivision. If there is no principal office, the local election official shall post the notice at the*

*building in which the governing body of the political or governmental subdivision held its first meeting of the calendar year in which the referenda is being held. **The notice may include an explanation of the question, in plain and neutral language, and its purposes supplied by the governing body of the political subdivision to whose voters the question is to be submitted.***

(10 ILCS 5/7-15, 7-18, 12-5)

MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 2005

Last day for the election authority to arrange with nursing home administrators the date and time to conduct in-person absentee voting in such facilities and to post a notice in the office of the election authority of all such arrangements.

(10 ILCS 5/19-12.2)

MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 2005

Last day for citizens of the United States temporarily residing outside the United States who are not registered but otherwise qualified to vote and who expect to be absent from their county of residence on election day to make simultaneous application to the election authority having jurisdiction over their precinct of residence for absentee registration and an absentee ballot and the last day for the election authority to mail such ballot.

(10 ILCS 5/20-2.1, 20-3)

TUESDAY, JANUARY 25, 2005

Last day for registration or transfer of registration in the office of the election authority. Area registration may apply in the City of Chicago. Please check with this jurisdiction for registration deadlines.

(10 ILCS 5/4-6, 4-16, 5-5, 5-23, 6-50, 6-53, 6-54)

NOTE: UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF NVRA, AGENCY AND MOTOR VEHICLE OFFICES WILL CONTINUE TO ACCEPT REGISTRATION AFTER THE STATUTORY CLOSE OF REGISTRATION. APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION COMPLETED WITHIN 5 DAYS OF REGISTRATION DEADLINE AT SECRETARY OF STATE FACILITIES AND QUALIFIED AGENCIES WILL BE TRANSMITTED WITHIN 5 DAYS OF COMPLETION AND MUST BE PROCESSED FOR THE NEXT ELECTION. A MAIL REGISTRATION APPLICATION SHALL BE DEEMED TIMELY FILED IF POSTMARKED PRIOR TO THE CLOSE OF REGISTRATION. IF NO POSTMARK EXISTS OR IF THE POSTMARK IS ILLEGIBLE, THE APPLICATION SHALL BE CONSIDERED TIMELY FILED IF RECEIVED BY THE ELECTION AUTHORITY NO LATER THAN 5 CALENDAR DAYS AFTER THE CLOSE OF REGISTRATION.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 25, 2005

Last day for registration of voters by deputy registrars, including municipal, township and road district clerks.

[10 ILCS 5/4-6.2(c), 5-16.2(c), 6-50.2(c)]

NOTE: Deputy registrars must return completed forms to the election authority within 7 days of the day on which they are completed. Registrations accepted during the period of 35 - 28 days before an election must be returned within 48 hours. Registrations accepted on the 28th day must be returned within 24 hours.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 26, 2005

Last day for deputy registrars who are officials or members of a bonafide labor organization to return unused registration materials to the election authority. Area registration may apply in the City of Chicago. Please check with this jurisdiction for registration and return of material deadlines.

(10 ILCS 5/4-6.2, 5-16.2, 6-50.2)

SUNDAY, JANUARY 30, 2005

Last day for election authority to supply absentee materials to local election officials (qualified municipal, township and road district clerks) who conduct in-person absentee voting.

(10 ILCS 5/19-2.1)

MONDAY, JANUARY 31, 2005

First day for local election officials (qualified municipal, township, and road district clerks) to conduct in-person absentee voting.

(10 ILCS 5/19-2.1)

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2005

Last day for aldermanic candidates in the City of Chicago to file their withdrawals of nomination in the office of the Board of Election Commissioners. *(Applicable only if a special election is required due to a mid-term vacancy)*

(65 ILCS 20/21-29)

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2005

Last day for election authority to submit computer disks containing voter registration information to the State Board of Elections (within 10 days following the close of registration for the February 22, 2005 Consolidated Primary Election).

(10 ILCS 5/4-8, 5-7, 6-35)

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2005

Last day for election authority to post in a conspicuous place in his office an announcement of the color of the primary ballot.

(10 ILCS 5/7-18)

MONDAY FEBRUARY 7, 2005

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2005

The dates on which a voter may file an application with the election authority to erase names from the registry of voters *(The National Voter Registration Act of 1993 may prohibit enforcement of this provision).*

(10 ILCS 5/4-12, 5-15, 6-44)

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2005

Last day for election authority to have pollwatcher credentials available for distribution.

(10 ILCS 5/7-34)

NOTE: Pollwatcher credentials may, at the discretion of the election authority, be distributed prior to this date. Credentials must be available on this date and up to, and including, election day.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2005

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 2005

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2005

Dates on which county clerks and Chicago Board of Election Commissioners shall hold hearings to determine whether names in the registry of voters shall be erased, registered or restored. *(The National Voter Registration Act of 1993 may prohibit enforcement of this provision.)*
(10 ILCS 5/4-13, 5-16, 6-45)

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2005

Last day for election authority to publish notice of primary and notice of referenda. Notice must include the color of the primary ballots, the polling hours, the offices for which candidates will be nominated and the political parties. (Must include list of precinct polling addresses unless published separately at least 10 days prior to the Consolidated Primary.) *The election authority shall post a copy of the notice at the principal office of the election authority. The local election official shall also post a copy of the notice at the principal office of the political or governmental subdivision. If there is no principal office, the local election official shall post the notice at the building in which the governing body of the political or governmental subdivision held its first meeting of the calendar year in which the referenda is being held. **The notice may include an explanation of the question, in plain and neutral language, and its purposes supplied by the governing body of the political subdivision to whose voters the question is to be submitted.***
(10 ILCS 5/7-15, 7-18, 12-5)

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2005

Last day for election authority to publish precinct polling place addresses if not included in election notice.
(10 ILCS 5/7-15)

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2005

Last day for any voter who is a member of the United States Service and his spouse and dependents of voting age who expect to be absent from the county of residence on election day to make application for an official ballot (may make application via facsimile machine or other method of electronic transmission) to the election authority having jurisdiction over their precinct residence, and the last day for the election authority to mail such ballot.
(10 ILCS 5/20-2, 20-2.3, 20-3)

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2005

Last day (by 5:00 p.m.) a person may file a notarized declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate with the proper election authority.
[10 ILCS 5/7-59(b)]

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2005

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2005

FILING OBJECTION PETITION

Nomination papers shall be deemed to be valid unless objections are filed in writing, **an original and one (1) copy, within 5 business** days after the last day for filing nomination papers.

PROCESSING OBJECTION

Not later than 12 noon on the second business day after the receipt of objector's petitions, the election authority or local election officials, **shall transmit by registered mail or receipted personal delivery**, the certificate of nomination or nomination papers and original objector's petition to the chairman of the proper electoral board designated in 5/10-9, or his authorized agent, and **shall transmit a copy by registered mail or receipted personal delivery** of the objector's petitions, to the candidate whose certificate of nomination or nomination papers are objected to, addressed to the place of residence designated in said certificate of nomination or nomination papers.

RESPONSIBILITY OF CHAIRMAN OF ELECTORAL BOARD

Within 24 hours after the receipt of objector's petition, the chairman of the electoral board other than the State Board of Elections shall **send a call by registered or certified mail**, to each of the members of the electoral board, objector, and candidate and shall also cause the sheriff of the county or counties in which such officers and persons reside to serve a copy of such call upon each of the officers and persons. The call shall state the day, hour and place at which the electoral board shall meet (in the case of the County Officers Electoral Board, the Municipal Officers Electoral Board, or the Education Officers Electoral Board, the hearing shall be held in the county courthouse. The Township Officers Electoral Board may meet at the county courthouse or the township office).

In those cases where the State Board of Elections is the designated electoral board, the Chairman of the State Board of Elections shall send the call to the objector and candidate whose certificate of nomination or nomination papers are objected to stating the day, hour and place at which the State Board of Elections shall meet (electoral board hearing may be held in the Capitol Building or in the principal or permanent branch office of the State Board of Elections).

ELECTORAL BOARD MEETING

Meetings of electoral board **shall not be less than 3 nor more than 5 days after receipt of objector's petitions** by chairman of electoral board.

JUDICIAL REVIEW FILED

Within 10 days after the decision of electoral board, candidate or objector aggrieved by decision of the board may file petition for judicial review with clerk of the circuit court. **Court hearings are to be held within 30 days after filing the petition** and the decision delivered promptly thereafter.

NO JUDICIAL REVIEW

If no petition for judicial review has been filed **within 10 days after the decision of the electoral board**, **the electoral board shall transmit a copy of its ruling together with the original certificate of nomination or nomination papers or petitions and the original objector's petitions** to the officers or board with whom they were on file and such officer or board shall abide by and comply with the ruling so made to all intents and purposes.
